University Faculty Senate Meeting Minutes April 3rd, 2017 EE 106, 2:00PM – 4:00PM

- 1. The UFS meeting was called to order by Dr. Chris Beetle at 2:00pm. The meeting was held in room EE 106 on the Boca Raton Campus and was video conferenced to Davie (DW 108), Fort Lauderdale (HEC 608), Harbor Branch (LE 235), Jupiter (SR 200), and Sea Tech (ST 259)
- **2. With positive approval**, the Senate approved <u>February 27, 2017</u> UFS Minutes.

3. President's Report

a. Dr. Chris Beetle begins his report with a discussion of the <u>University Faculty Senate bylaws</u> revision. The University Faculty Senate will address the bylaws revision at the May meeting.

4. Speakers

- a. Dr. Mary Cameron, Chair, UFS Distance Education Committee
 - Or. Mary Cameron begins her presentation by discussing the 2008 Office Hours Policy. In Fall 2013 the Faculty observations and concerns consisted of mandatory F2F hours for online instructors not update in five years, unevenly applied, and summer online instructors' off-campus research needs. The Senate President at the time Ron Nyhan reinstated the DiSL Committee. In Summer 2014, there was a decision to suspend mandatory F2F office hours for online courses, may substitute with synchronous or asynchronous remote communication. Next, a survey was conducted in February 2015 and the results were that faculty effectively communicate remotely with students. The April 2015 policy revision resulted in the Provost eliminating the mandatory F2F office hours for online courses, instructor's discretion to use synchronous or asynchronous remote communication.
 - Next, the Florida 2025 SUS Online Strategic Plan consists of FAU online courses stats which will be presented by Assistant Provost for eLearning Dr. Victoria Brown at the next Senate meeting. Select 2025 goals consist of 75% of Undergraduate and 50% of Graduate Studies take at least one online course per year. The FAU Response is intellectual foundations courses, increase online courses, minors, majors, and programs, increase QM and other course quality certifications, an increase OER (Open Educational Resources) use, and colleges, departments, and programs could consider the following options to build their capacity to provide online courses and programs.
 - Intellectual property rights and online courses consists of complex federal and state laws and multiple creator and unit/program scenarios which equals the university policy – DOR IPP 2013 College Bargaining Agreement.
 - IPR documents include the FAU Division of Research IPP 2013 (DOR IPP), UFF Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) 2015-2018, FAU support units which include policy such as CeL and no policy such as WAC and OURI.
 - Faculty members own their online courses with independent efforts. Faculty members do not own university supported works, institutional works, regular instructional works, and contractual works. Faculty members might own regular instructional works and canvas converted courses not previously owned by FAU.

 To conclude, the DiSL Committee Recommendations on IPP include receiving input from the faculty and meet with DOR, TT and others to review IPP policy in light of faculty input, AAUP recommendations, and SUS practices.

b. Chief Sean Brammer, FAU Police

- Chief Sean Brammer begins his presentation by addressing the Senate that the FAU Police Department is a full staff Police department and can only move 1,000 feet of FAU borders.
 The FAU Police patrols the campus 24/7 and a full dispatch.
- Next, the Police Department has a safety app called "FAU Guardian" for smart phones. The
 emergency button will be at your disposal if the Faculty, Staff, or Student member has an
 fau.edu email. The new system called "Next Gen" will allow faculty, staff, and students text
 911 by the Fall semester.
- Finally, Chief Brammer is working with Azita Dashtaki Dotiwala from the Division of Facilities to allow each College to purchase parking spots and review more spaces for Faculty and Staff members.

 Distance Learning presentation. The Board of Governors accrued the implementation SUS
 strategic plan for online education 2025. The strategic plan will have FAU share online
 courses with other institutions.
- Next, the recent Board of Governors meeting discussed the Senate and House bills on Higher Education. The discussion included a possible switch to a four-year metric from a sixyear metric next year and the fall 2018 block tuition policy. There is also a discussion to increase bright futures funding in the summer semester and a notion to recruit world class

- faculty. Finally, there was a discussion of an implementation for a civics proficiency course for all Higher Education institutions.
- O Moving forward, there are three Dean's searches underway. Dr. Russ Ivy is leading the College of Engineering & Computer Science Dean's search, Dean Valerie Bristor is leading the College for Design and Social Inquiry Dean's Search and Dean Carol Hixson is leading the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters Dean's Search. There are final candidates for the College of Engineering & Computer Science as well as the College for Design and Social Inquiry. The Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters Dean's search is moving forward and the interim Dean will be announced in the next week.
