University Faculty Senate Meeting Minutes May 1, 2017 EE 106, 2:00PM – 4:00PM

- 1. The UFS meeting was called to order by Dr. Chris Beetle at 2:00pm. The meeting was held in room EE 106 on the Boca Raton Campus and was video conferenced to Davie (DW 108), Fort Lauderdale (HEC 608), Harbor Branch (LE 235), Jupiter (SR 200), and Sea Tech (ST 259)
- **2. With positive approval**, the Senate approved April 3rd, 2017 UFS Minutes.

3. President's Report

a. Dr. Chris Beetle begins his report discussing the results from the Steering Committee and Academic Planning and Budget Committee Elections. Dr. Bruce Arneklev, Dr. Kim Dunn, and Dr. Mike Harris were elected to the Steering Committee. Dr. Fred Hoffman, Dr. Morton Levitt, and Dr. Meredith Mountford were elected to the Academic Planning and Budget Committee.

4. Speakers

- a. Dr. Victoria Brown, Assistant Provost for eLearning
 - o Dr. Victoria Brown begins her presentation on the Center for eLearning Update by announcing that there has been a 14% growth from 2013/2014 to 2016/2017.
 - The 2025 Online Education Plan has 40% total enrollment, 70% undergraduate, 50% of graduate, and 60% of academic programs.
 - Spring online enrollment by College shows the most undergraduate and graduate students coming from the College of Business.
 - FAU has four fully online degree rankings 1) Best Online Graduate Business: Ranked 32 in US News and World Report, 2) Best Online Graduate Nursing Program: Ranked 43 in US News and World Report, 3) Best Online Colleges in Florida: Ranked 10 in BestOnlineColleges.com, and 4) Best Online Criminal Justice Degree: Ranked 14 in Best Affordable Online.
 - The 2025 Online Plan for Student Services involves four components 1) Student Affairs, 2)
 LINK Advisors, 3) Transfer Students, and 4) Center for eLearning.
 - The Florida Quality Rating includes QM, approved university rubric, certify every three years, and working on the state award.
 - The 2025 Online Plan OER includes putting together an OER platform, state catalog labeling courses with OER, expecting faculty to share OER, and FAU-impacting Metric 3: rolling out a campaign fall 2017.
 - The shared courses includes creating a system to catalog and search for courses shared in the Canvas Commons, course material can be modified, and will need to be adapted to the template.
 - The shared degrees includes a list of programs identified, struggling with where to keep the inventory, and decided a governance committee is needed.
 - The 2025 Online Plan Research and Innovation include currently working on a 3D integration into math classes, wanting to hear from faculty about Canvas needs, creating a faculty committee to sponsor projects, and preparing to submit a proposal for research money.

- The student support online scorecard was approved and recommendation for technology grants for students was approved.
- Finally, Canvas will be arriving on May 15th. There are opportunities to make sure the courses are student ready, including the Office of Information Technologies and Center for eLearning support, training and professional development, templates, and open labs.

b. President John Kelly

- President John Kelly begins his presentation by announcing that FAU is still waiting on the metrics results from the past year. The Board of Governors is focusing on the cost of degree, changing the choice metric to a maximum of 7 points, and a 4-year vs. a 6-year graduation rate.
- The FAU Foundation is moving towards a capital campaign within the next year. FAU has to be strategic on what to spend the funding on. This is the third consecutive year of fundraising growth. \$28 million from two years ago to a goal of \$30 million this year. The Sandler Family gave \$7.25 million dollars to FAU, \$7 million of that funding to name The Phyllis and Harvey Sandler School of Social Work within the College for Design and Social Inquiry. \$250,000 will be going to the Schmidt Family Complex for Academic and Athletic Excellence.
- o FAU is currently working towards the pre preeminent range.
- o In addition, FAU is working towards recruiting students with a 4.0 from out of state schools.
- Jeff Atwater was recently hired as the Vice President for Strategic Initiatives and CFO. His job will be to find the funding that FAU needs to build the campus. Currently, there are 4,100 beds on campus and FAU is looking to expand on and off campus.
- Finally, FAU is still finalizing the searches for the new Dean for the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters College for Design and Social Inquiry, and the College of Engineering and Computer Science.

- o In addition, 40 Colleagues have retired or resigned in the past year.
- FAU is still finalizing the searches for the new Dean for the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters College for Design and Social Inquiry, and the College of Engineering and Computer Science.
- o Finally, Admissions is on track to admit 3,100 FTIC students in the fall 2017 semester.
