University Faculty Senate Meeting Minutes November 5th, 2018 EE 106, 1:00PM – 3:00PM

Members and Guests Present: See Appendix A for attendance sheet.

- 1. The UFS meeting was called to order by Dr. Kevin Wagner at 1:00pm. The meeting was held in room EE 106 on the Boca Raton Campus and was video conferenced to Davie (DW 108), Fort Lauderdale (HEC 608), Harbor Branch (LE 206G, Jupiter (SR 200), and Sea Tech (ST 250)
- **2. With positive approval**, the Senate approved October 8th, 2018 UFS Minutes.

3. President's Report

- **a.** Dr. Kevin Wagner announces that the Academic Planning and Budget Committee will review the withdrawal date, SPOT scores, and mini-mester's and then make a recommendation to the Steering committee before sending it back to the Senate.
- **b.** After a discussion led by Brian Hodge, Registrar, Banner 8 is moving to Banner 9. Dr. Wagner will continue to communicate with Brian Hodge regarding solutions to Banner 9.
- **c.** Finally, Dr. Wagner will be creating the Reinvigorating Faculty Governance Committee that will look into overall Senate participation. The committee is open to all Senators.

4. Speakers

- a. Dr. Ron Nyhan, Executive Director, FAU's Community Engagement
 - Dr. Nyhan begins by discussing the Community Engagement Culture at FAU in A Strategic Plan for the Race to Excellence 2015-2025 through the mission, vision, values, platform, and goal (place). The culture is deeply ingrained in the actions of faculty and staff.
 - Engagement is defined as "Community engagement describes collaboration between institutions of higher education and their larger communities (local, regional/state, national, global) for the mutually beneficial exchange of knowledge and resources in a context of partnership and reciprocity."
 - There are 4 levels of Community Engagement including 1) shared decision-making, 2) community provides guidance, 3) FAU is given access to facilities or participants, and 4) Institution shares knowledge.
 - The role of UFS and faculty to date has 1) established the first working committee to begin to collect faculty-led CE data, 2) promoted ASL courses and streamlined the ASL approval process, and 3) developed the recommendations for including CE in annual evaluations and P&T.
 - Awards and Grants include:
 - Presidential Awards for Faculty (Teaching, Research, Service: \$3,500).
 - o FAU Wave 2.0 (through DoR) \$1,500 to one project.
 - Undergraduate CE research (through OURI) \$500 per student.
 - o Graduate CE research (through Grad College) \$500 per student.
 - Community Engagement Research Grants (\$1,500).
 - Performance include:

- Community engaged activities included in FAIR definitions (optional) for Annual Faculty Evaluations.
- Promotion and Tenure criteria at University and College levels (5).
- o The Office of Community Engagement:
- o Community Engagement is in the Office of the President.
- The mission of the office is to encourage, communicate and document community engaged teaching, research/scholarship, and service at FAU.
- Based on a "distributed ownership" model.
- o The Carnegie Classification:
- Mandated by BOG by 2025 (5-year application timeline).
- o 7 of 12 SUS institutions have successfully received the classification.
- o Application deadline April 15, 2019.
- o The application process has 106 Total 500-word responses and the draft is 80% complete.
- The draft has had 1 internal and 1 external review.
- The scheduled completion of the application is March 2019.
- Faculty can help by 1) continue to celebrate/communicate faculty contributions to the community, 2) actively support further development of community based experiential learning and research in your colleges, 3) send us information on successful community activities and partnerships through your College Liaison or directly, and 4) Include community engagement activities on your annual reviews, SPE and P&T submissions.
- o In addition, contact the College Liaison for syllabus review and certification.
- Finally, there will be a new recommended ASL Designation Process for new Undergraduate courses, existing Undergraduate courses, new Graduate courses, and existing Graduate courses.
- **b.** Danita Nias, Vice President for Advancement, Chief Executive Officer, FAU Foundation
 - Vice President Danita Nias has been tasked with 1) fundraising, 2) alumni affairs, and 3) corporate support.
 - FAU is currently exploring the possibility of a capital campaign. FAU has not been in a campaign in over 20 years.
 - Vice President Danita Nias is working on raising funds from private support north of Jupiter to south of Broward.
 - FAU has tested two mini campaigns 1) FAU Henderson School raising almost 4 million dollars and 2) the Kelly/Strul Emerging Scholars campaign raising 1 million the first year and then \$980,000 the second year. The campaign assisted in admitting 20 first generation students.
 - FAU hired external consultants from July to October to assess the fundraising and alumni operations. The external consultants gave FAU recommendations prior to starting a capital campaign.
 - FAU has recently received multiple principal gifts in the millions of dollars to the naming of the Phyllis and Harvey Sandler School of Social Work and research for Dr. Galvin in the Charles E. Schmidt College of Medicine.
 - o To conclude, Vice President Danita Nias will follow up in the spring on where the university is on the planning of the capital campaign.
