Interdisciplinary Minor in Film and Video

Program Description

Mission

The Interdisciplinary Minor in Film and Video gives students with any major the opportunity to bring together courses from several departments and colleges into a multidisciplinary curriculum emphasizing all aspects of film and video. Participating are faculty from communication and multimedia studies, literature, languages, anthropology, theatre and other disciplines. The program offers scholarly study of the history, theory and criticism of film, video and television as well as hands-on courses in video production.

Enrollment

The program is open to all degree-seeking students, with the exception of those pursuing the BA in Multimedia Studies (Sequence in Film, Video and New Media). To declare the minor, students must follow the procedures set by the Registrar's Office and include the minor on the Application for Degree. The minor will be awarded on completion of the bachelor's degree. The application on the reverse of this brochure allows students to receive information about program events and updates; it is not a substitute for the filing requirements set by the Registrar.

Requirements

All courses taken in the program may be counted toward other graduation requirements. Students must follow the distribution guidelines and complete a minimum of five courses. Each course must be completed with a grade of "C" or better to be counted towards the minor. At least 75 percent of all credits for the minor must be earned at FAU. In addition to the regular curriculum, other courses with significant attention to film and video may be approved by the Program Director.
