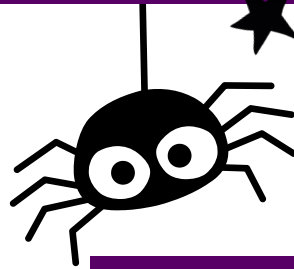

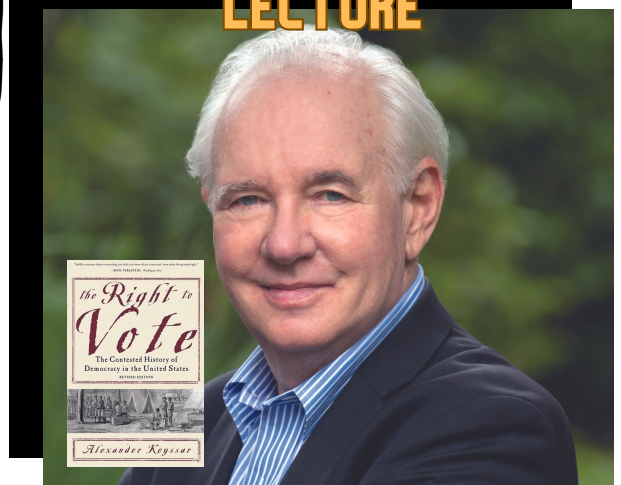

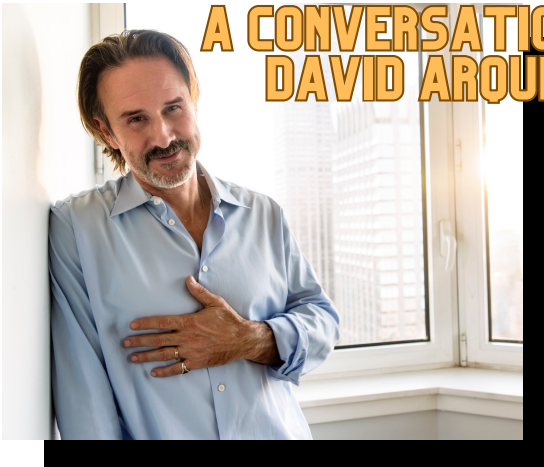
## JOHN O'SULLIVAN LECTURE
