FAU High School Tops Florida Public Schools for National Merit Semifinalists

A total of 34 <u>Florida Atlantic</u> <u>University (FAU) High School</u> students have been named semifinalists in the 2021 <u>National Merit Scholarship</u> <u>Competition</u>. These high school seniors will now have the opportunity to compete for 7,600 National Merit scholarships worth more than \$30 million.

FAU High is No. 1 out of all public and charter schools in the state for national merit semifinalists.

To become a National Merit semifinalist, more than 1.5 million high school juniors took the 2019 Preliminary SAT/ National Merit Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT). DID YOU KNOW?

Thinking of applying to an Honors in the Majors program? FAU College of Education offers two **Honors in the Majors programs**:

DEPARTMENT OF EXCEPTIONAL STUDENT EDUCATION

Students seeking a Bachelor's in Exceptional Student Education (ESE) degree may apply for admission no later than the spring of junior year to the <u>ESE Honors in the</u> <u>Major</u> if they are fully admitted and programmed in the ESE program and have a 3.5 Overall (cumulative) GPA. This requires submitting an application form, ESE program sheet and letter of recommendation from a Florida Atlantic University (FAU) ESE faculty member.



Honoring Outstanding Owl Teachers (HOOT), the ESE Honors in the Major program, offers outstanding students the option to explore an expanded view of their future profession and the broader social context of their work. This program culminates with an honors designation on the students' transcript.

DEPARTMENT OF TEACHING AND LEARNING

Students seeking a Bachelor's in Elementary Education, who have an interest in nature, animals or the environment, may apply for the <u>EEhEE Honors in the Major</u> <u>Program</u>, if they have been admitted to the College of Education as an Elementary Education major and have completed at least 60 credits with at least a 3.0 overall GPA. No more than 20 percent of elementary education majors may be eligible for the EEhEE program.

<u>Elementary Education with Honors in the Environmental Education (EEhEE)</u> is an Honors in the Major program that shows preservice teachers how environmental

education can be integrated into elementary and middle school classrooms. The program has a strong undergraduate research theme that explicitly links teacher action research to the Florida nature of science standards.
