NOTE: The BECE is a joint degree program offered by the Department of Curriculum and Instruction (DCI) and the Department of Special Education (SPED). The BECE degree is designed to prepare preschool teachers and related personnel for employment in the fields of child care and children's services, working with young children from birth to age five. The BECE degree requires 60 credits beyond the AA or completion of General Education Core Requirements.
