ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Charles E. Schmidt College of Science is home to several nationally recognized research centers. The Center for Cryptology and Information Security is recognized as a National Center for Academic Excellence in Information Assurance/Cyber Defense Research and is dedicated to pioneering research in cryptology and information security.

COLLEGE OF NURSING

FAU's Christine E. Lynn College of Nursing ranked No. 1 in Florida for the 71 graduates of its Bachelor of Science in Nursing program who achieved a 100 percent passage rate on the National Council Licensure Examination.

HARRIET L. WILKES HONORS COLLEGE RECEIVES TOP NATIONAL RATING

The Harriet L. Wilkes Honors College (WHC) received a top rating in the fall 2018 edition of *Inside Honors*. Of the 50 public university honors programs reviewed this year, the WHC is one of seven to receive the top rating, sharing the limelight with honors colleges at Penn State and Arizona State universities, among others.

COLLEGE OF MEDICINE RANKINGS

According to *U.S. News & World Report's* "Best Medical Schools" ranking, FAU's **Schmidt College of Medicine** is among 13 medical schools nationwide where humanities and social sciences majors were best represented among incoming students in fall 2017.
