#### University Faculty Senate Meeting Minutes December 11, 2017 EE 106, 1:00PM – 3:00PM

**1.** The UFS meeting was called to order by Dr. Kevin Wagner at 1:00pm. The meeting was held in room EE 106 on the Boca Raton Campus and was video conferenced to Davie (DW 108), Fort Lauderdale (HEC 608), Harbor Branch (LE 206G, Jupiter (SR 200), and Sea Tech (ST 250)

2. With positive approval, the Senate approved <u>November 13, 2017</u> UFS Minutes.

#### 3. President's Report

- Dr. Kevin Wagner begins his report by announcing that Jeff Atwater, Vice President of Strategic Initiatives and Chief Financial Officer will be the guest speaker at the January Senate meeting. The Police Chief Sean Brammer and Head Football Coach Lane Kiffin will speak at the April Senate Meetings.
- b. Next, Dr. Wagner let the Senators know that the live stream is available for faculty members but is not a substitution for Senators.

#### 4. Speakers

- a. President John Kelly
  - President John Kelly begins his presentation by wishing everyone Happy Holidays.
  - This past year, FAU had a little bit over \$8 million dollars in mandated waivers. President Kelly encourages faculty to look into different kinds of revenue streams.
  - Next, FAU is currently targeting out of state recruitment as a great revenue opportunity for the University. President Kelly sent 500 letters to students that FAU is recruiting this year. Out of state applications are up 38% over this time last year.
  - Research funding and private giving have both increased this year compared to this time last year.
  - President Kelly just returned from Israel. FAU has new agreements with several Israeli Universities.
  - Today, FAU signed an agreement with Max Planck Florida Institute for Neuroscience. FAU will become the first in the world academic partner with Max Planck.
  - The strategic plan advisory group has agreed to restart the Masters Teachers Program.
  - Finally, President Kelly attended the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities this past November and the discussion has been about DACA, taxation on graduate stipends, free speech, and hazing in Greek Life at Universities.

- Finally, the upcoming legislative session has Senate Bill 4, the increasing of bright futures as well as the Civics competency courses.
