a. Dr. Kevin Wagner announces the results from the elections. Dr. Paul Peluso, Dr. Meredith Mountford, and Dr. Morton Levitt were elected to the Steering Committee.   - In 2013, FAU had one national merit scholar, this fall FAU will have between 25 and 31.
  - FAU currently has 3,030 deposits for fall and summer. The goal is to have 3,200 deposits.
  - President Kelly congratulated Amy Wright and Randy Blakely for joining the National Academy of Inventors.
  - $\circ$  The 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter numbers are up 18% in Research.
  - The FAU Gala raised \$3.6 million dollars in charity and 846 tickets sold.
  - Boca Regional Hospital and Jupiter Medical will be acquired soon. FAU will be involved in the final discussions.
  - There are 3 candidates on campus this week for Provost. The provost will take the taking the strategic plan to the next step, keep FAU in the top 3 in the performance metrics, help build a capital campaign, provide leadership and collegiality for all colleges, and a commitment to shared governance and appreciation.
  - Finally, President Kelly thanks Provost Perry for his service as Provost of the University.

  - Dr. Diane Alperin discusses the Women in Science and Engineering Leadership Institute (WISELI) at FAU.
  - FAU is a recipient of an ADVANCE grant from the National Science Foundation.
