Bachelor of Arts with Major in Global Studies

(Minimum of 120 credits required)

The program in Global Studies leads to a B.A. degree. To earn a B.A. degree in Global Studies, students must complete the following coursework with a minimum grade of "C" (36 total credits in the major):

- 1. IDS 3313 Global Studies I, 3 credits;
- 2. IDS 4315 Global Studies II, 3 credits;
- 3. IDS 4332 Cultural Study of Globality, 3 credits;
- 4. One of the following: FOL 3880 Research and Bibliographic Methods, 3 credits; SYA 3300 Sociological Analysis: A Survey of Methods, 3 credits; SYA 4310 Qualitative Research Methods, 3 credits; or equivalent course;
- 5. IDS 4915 Directed Independent Research, 3 credits;
- 6. Two 3000-level or above experiential courses (study abroad courses or internship courses), 6 credits
- 6. Five elective courses from four categories, three which must be from one category and one course each from two additional areas. No more than three 3000-level courses may be counted from any one academic unit or department, 15 credits:
- 7. A minimum of 120 credits, 60 of which must be from a senior institution.

Students entering FAU as freshmen must meet the University's General Education/four-year degree program requirements as listed in the Degree Requirements section of this catalog and the College's requirements as set forth under Undergraduate Programs in the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters. Students earning a BA in Global Studies are expected to select General Education courses in keeping with the nature of the degree with the following stipulations

- a. In Foundations of Written Communication: ENC 1101 and substitute for ENC 1102 either ANT 1471 Cultural Differences in a Globalized Society, ENC 1930 Honors Seminar Writing, or HIS 2050 Writing History. Students should earn a minimum of B+ for each of these two classes.
- In Foundations of Mathematics and Quantitative Reasoning: STA 2023 for which students should earn a minimum of a B
- c. In Foundations of Society and Human Behavior: ECO 2013 Macroeconomic or INR 2002 Introduction to World Politics for which students should earn a minimum of a B+

FAU has a foreign language requirement that all students pursuing majors within the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters must fulfill for the B.A. degree. Students earning a BA in Global Studies must complete two language courses at the "intermediate" level or above. Students have met this requirement if they have passed or received credit for two semesters of one foreign language at one of Florida's state colleges or at another college or university. Students who have not completed two semesters of foreign language at a college or university must use 8 of their out-of-discipline credits to meet FAU's foreign language requirement, or pass the CLEP exam prior to graduation. For additional information, refer to the foreign language requirement policy.

Prerequisite Coursework for Transfer Students

Students transferring to Florida Atlantic University must complete both lower-division requirements (including the requirements of the Intellectual Foundations Program) and requirements for the College and major. Lower-division requirements may be completed through the A.A. degree from any Florida public college, university or community college or through equivalent coursework at another regionally accredited institution. Before transferring and to ensure timely progress toward the baccalaureate degree, students must also complete the prerequisite courses for their major as outlined in the <u>Transition Guides</u>.

All courses not approved by the Florida Statewide Course Numbering System that will be used to satisfy requirements will be evaluated individually on the basis of content and will require a catalog course description and a copy of the syllabus for assessment.
