HISTORY MAJOR

FAU MINIMUMS: 120 cr. Total / 45 cr. upper div. / 30 cr. at FAU / Majors must complete a minimum of 42 credit hours of History courses with a "C" or better in each course.

HISTORY MINOR

MINIMUM 18 CR. / 15 cr. upper div., 15 at FAU / "C" minimum in all 18 credits, courses must cover at least two geographical areas (U.S., Europe, African, Latin, Non-Western)

TRACK 1: Take one lower division survey + five upper division courses (3000-4000)

TRACK 2: Take six upper division (3000-4000)

CONCENTRATION WITHIN THE HISTORY MAJOR

RELIGIOUS HISTORY: Take at least 15 cr. from courses marked † (relevant senior seminar or special topics courses may also qualify); at least one course from all four fields: U.S., Asian, Judaic, and European.

BRITISH HISTORY: Take Medieval, Modern, and Tudor-Stuart England, plus two others marked £ (relevant senior seminar or special topics courses may also qualify)
