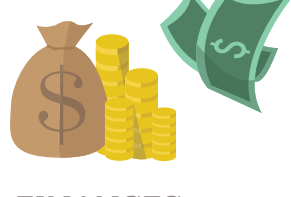

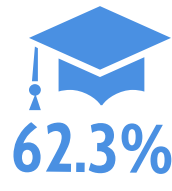

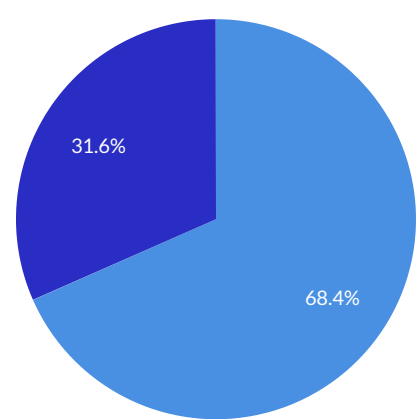

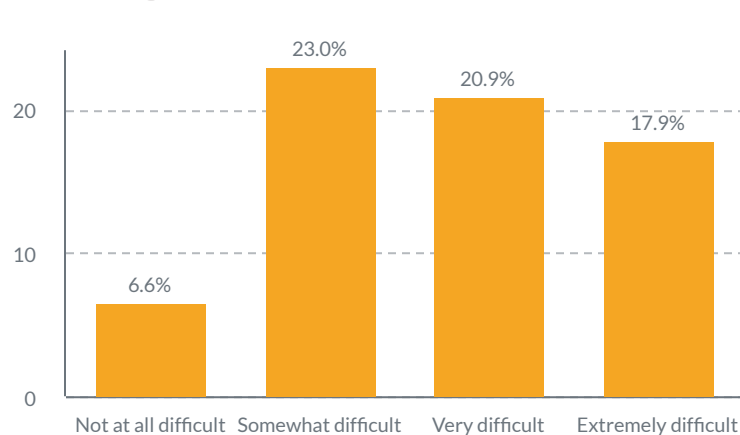


EXPERIENCE DAMAGE FROM STORM DURING THE PANDEMIC

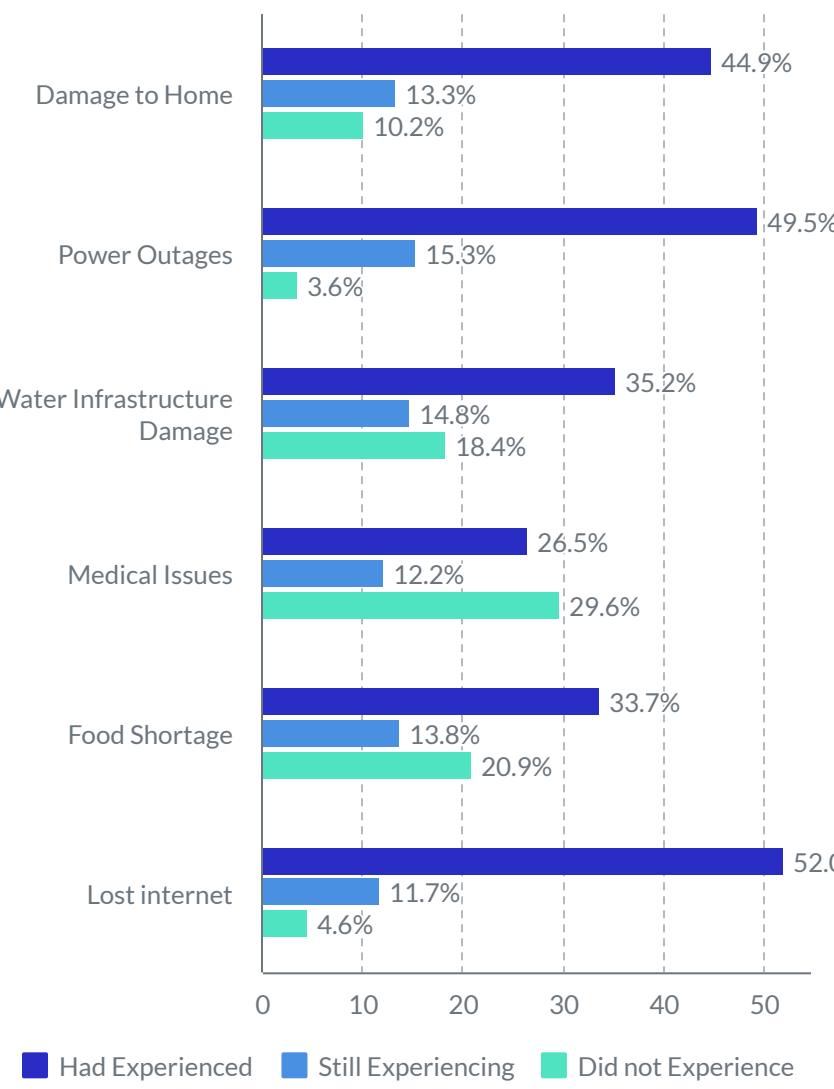
Experienced damage to residence



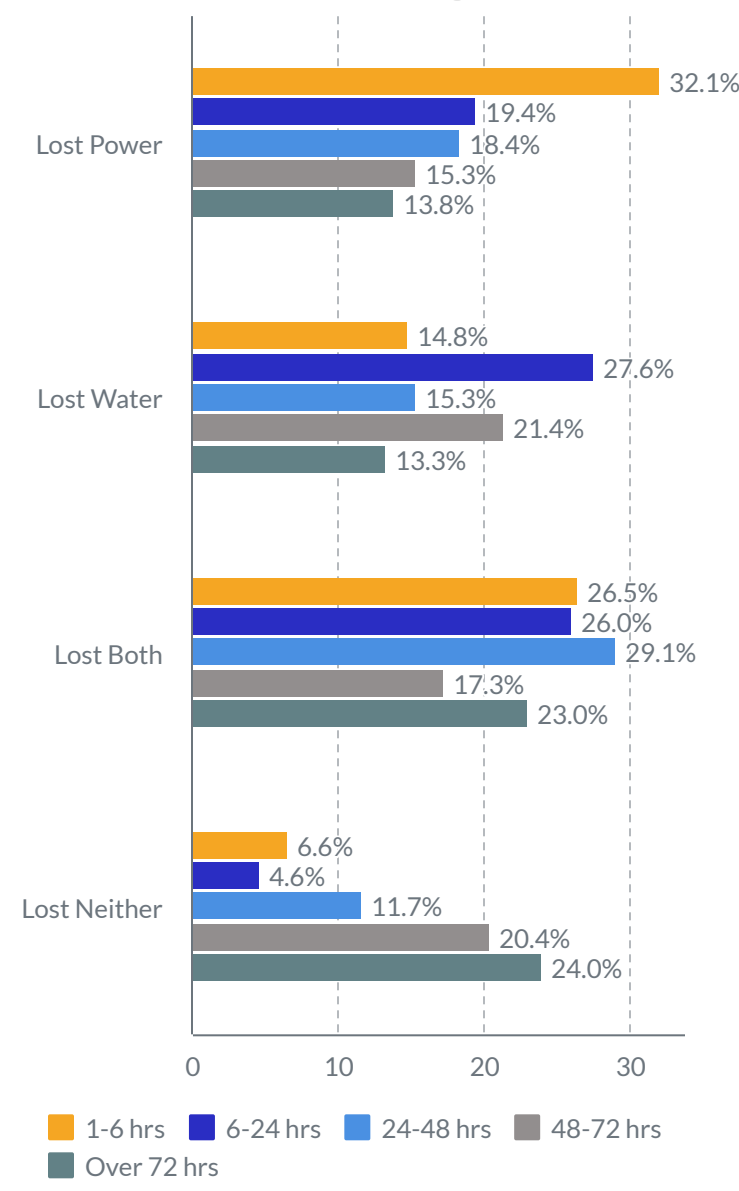
How difficult was it to cope with the storm during the middle of a pandemic?



Issues Experienced as a Result of Damages to Property

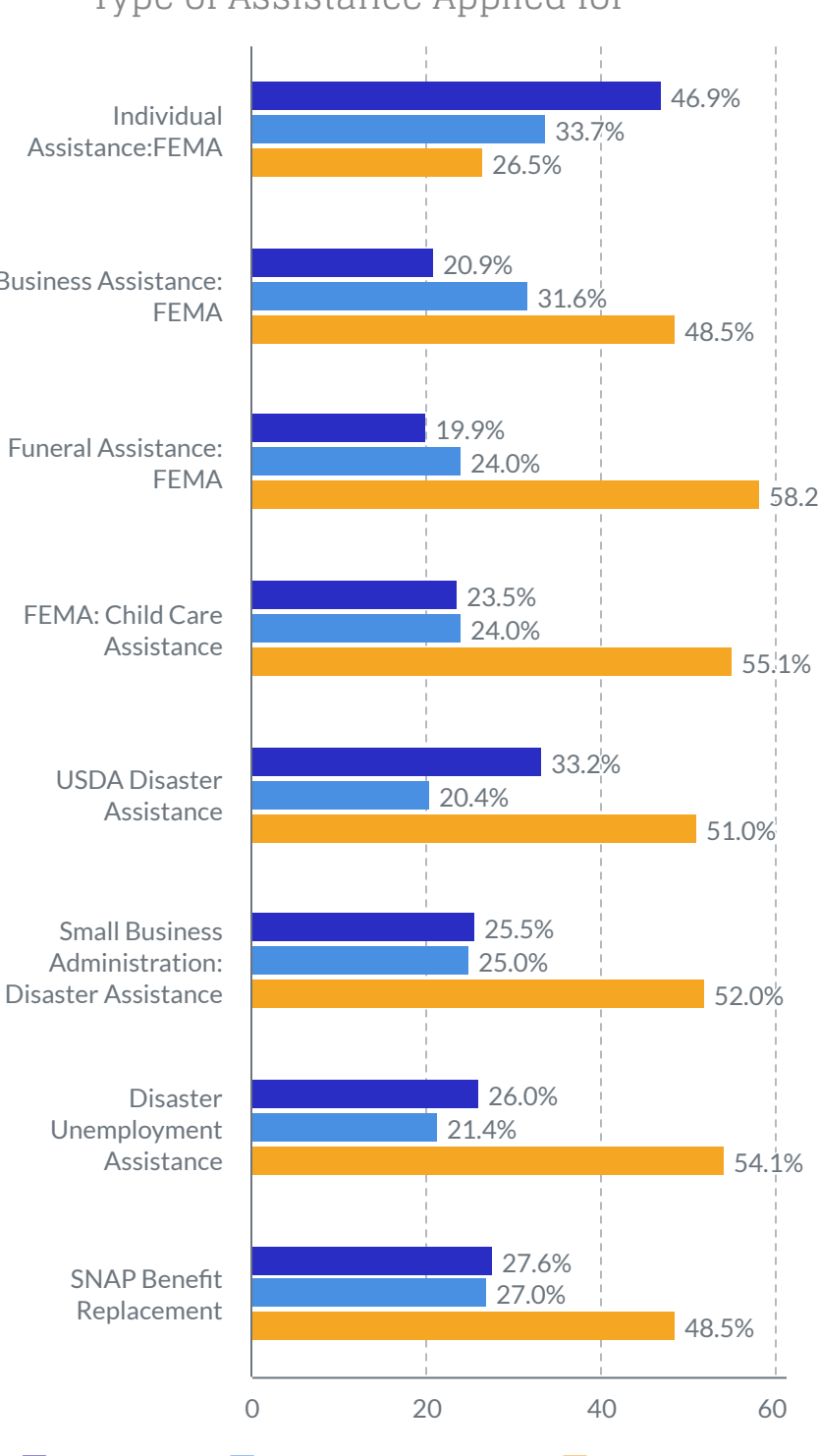


Lost Power or Water During Winter Storm

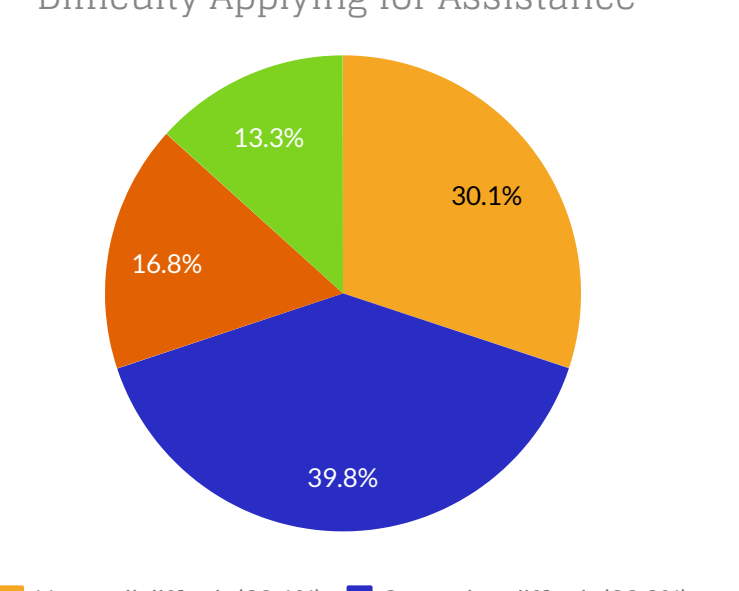

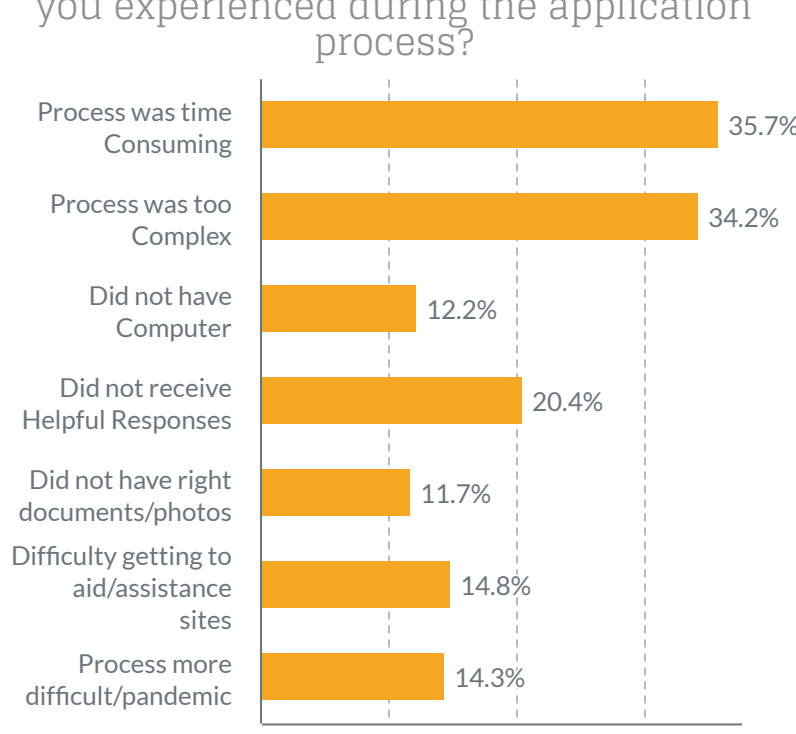
Type of Assistance Applied for



Difficulty Applying for Assistance

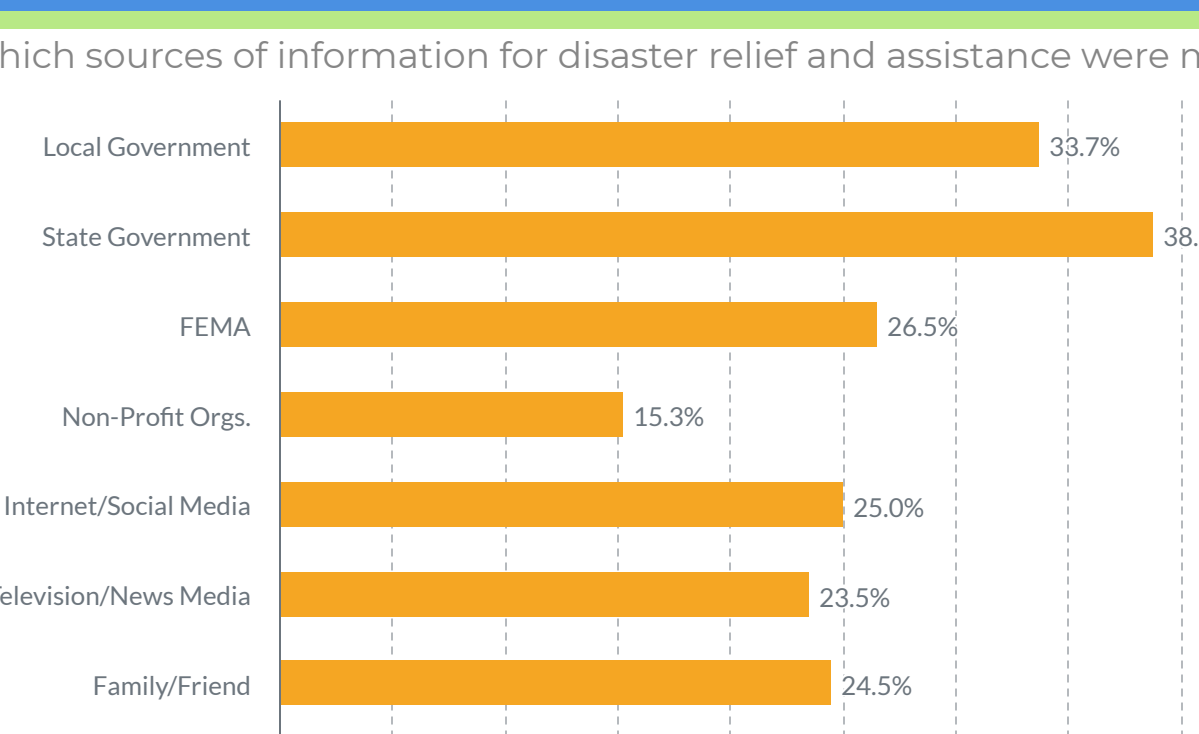


What were the reasons for the difficulties you experienced during the application process?
