










### 2016 Legislative Platform

#### kpand Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Disbursements

**ASK:** Allow Bright Futures Program to cover summer credit hours by appropriating the necessary funding from the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund. We request that the following methods be considered: (1) Additional allocation granted by the Florida Legislative branch for the purpose of Summer Bright Futures funding. (2) Revision of the Florida State Board of Education rules and regulations to allow additional Bright Futures funding to be awarded during the summer term. (3) Restoration of the Bright Futures scholarship award amounts from 75% and 50% to 100% and 75% award amounts required for the program of study, respectively."

**RATIONALE:** The BOG analysis of the impact of funding summer credit hours stipulates, "the benefit to students includes faster time-to-degree, quicker entry into the job market, and the likelihood of reduced debt." The Education Enhancement Trust Fund, which funds Bright Futures only in Fall and Spring semester currently is projected to have a \$75 million surplus this year; the State is statutorily required to allocate funds to Bright Futures before any other educational use. The expansion of bright futures contributes to a better-educated workforce, speedier graduation, and more efficient use of campus facilities throughout the entire year.

#### Support Legislation Act Relating to Postsecondary Access and Affordability

ASK: Co-sponsor or support (SB 984 and HB 7019)

**RATIONALE:** Tuition costs static, this legislation focuses on reducing educational costs that encumber students by requiring BOG & SBE to submit annual report on college affordability; revising provisions relating to textbook & instructional materials affordability; requiring certain universities & institutions to provide public notice relating to tuition and fees; & revising provisions relating to tuition differential. (partial bill summary language)

#### upport Legislation Relating to Bright Futures Scholarship Program

ASK: Co-sponsor or support (SB 520/ SB 990 and HB 793)

**RATIONALE:** Excellent Florida high school graduates that have earned the a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship award and become unable to accept the award initially because of religious or service obligations are provided access to and renewal of their earned merit-based scholarship after the completion of their aforementioned obligations.

#### Support Board of Governor Legislative Budget Request

ASK: Support Funding of (2) Board of Governor's Legislative Budget Request on:

#### 1. Mental Health Counseling Services

**RATIONALE:** All Florida students deserve equal access to mental health services; this LBR will raise the staffing levels of the SUS Counseling Centers to the minimum staffing ratios that are recommended by the profession's accreditation association, (IACS). Currently, ten of the 12 SUS counseling centers (not New College and Florida Polytechnic) are operating above the IACS standard for minimum staffing.






# A THREAT TO THE FAU COMMUNITY
