FIRST-GENERATION DEFINITION

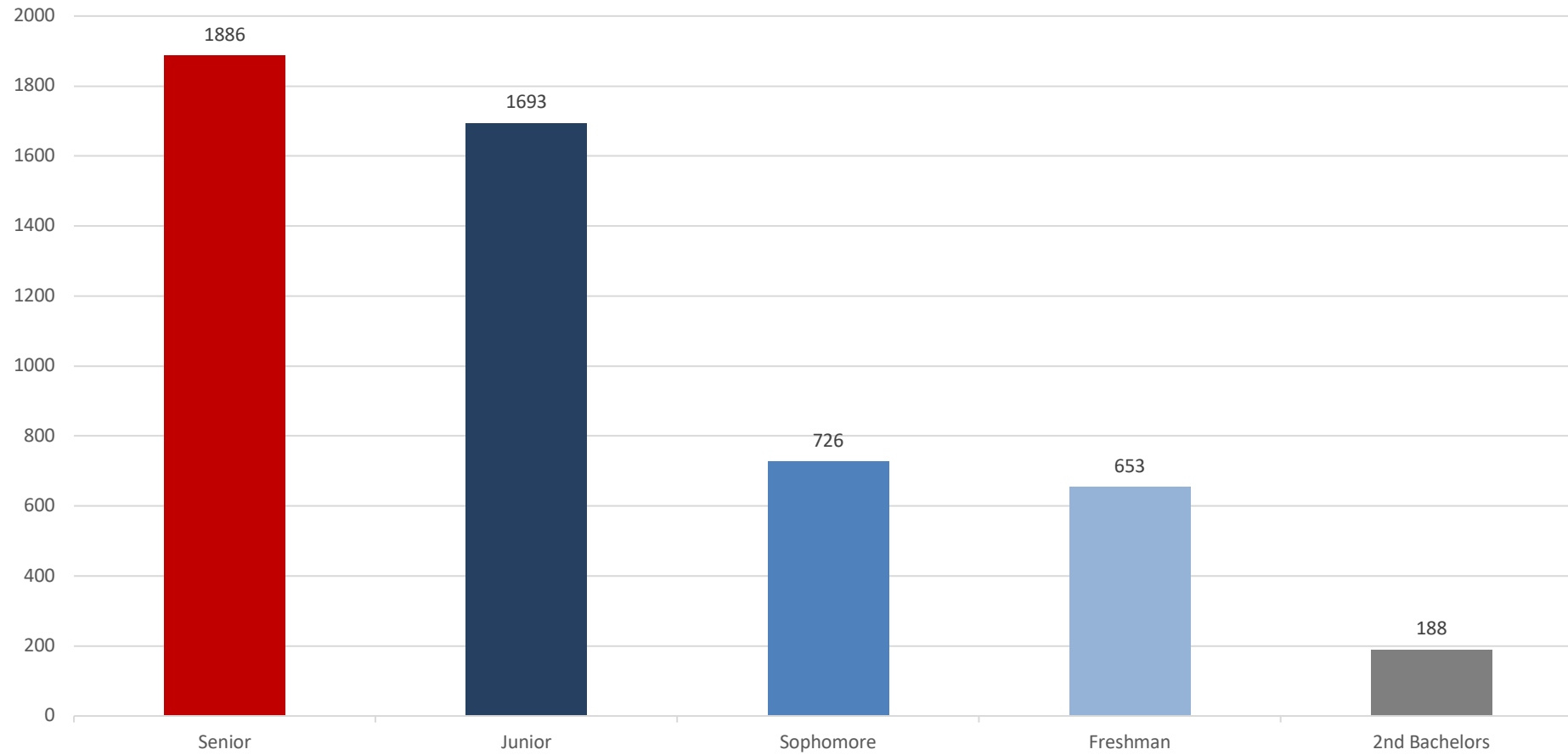
First-Generation students are defined as those whose parents' or guardians' highest level of education is a high school diploma or less. In cases where parents have different levels of education, the maximum level of education determines the student's status. Neither parent or guardian may have an earned 4-year degree.

MISSION

The First-Generation Student Success Office serves as a referral hub to the various services that exist to inspire and assist first-generation students at Florida Atlantic University, including: advising, financial assistance and scholarships, career services, first-generation student mentorship, and the first-generation registered student organization (First and Proud).
