PROPOSED COMMITTEE ACTION

Request for approval of the conferral of Honorary Doctorate on James Patterson.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

University Policy 2.3 (Honorary Doctorates) specifies that those nominated for Honorary Doctorates be recommended to the FAU Board of Trustees by the University Faculty Senate Honors and Awards Committee, the Provost and the President. One candidate is being recommended at this time.

James Patterson has been nominated by Valerie Bristor, Dean of the College of Education, for his outstanding achievements in literature and his contributions in public service. A graduate of Manhattan College and Vanderbilt University, Mr. Patterson has had nineteen consecutive #1 New York Times bestselling novels. He has received many awards for his writing, including the Edgar Awards Mystery Writers of America, Reader's Digest Reader's Choice Award, Mystery Guild's Thriller of the Year Award, International Thriller of the Year Award and Children's Choice Book Award.

It is in the area of reading that Mr. Patterson has contributed much in the area of public service. He is the founder of the James Patterson Page Turner Awards to recognize groups and individuals for spreading the joy of reading. He also established the ReadKiddoread.com website to help adults find books that kids will love. James Patterson Scholarships have been established at Manhattan College, Vanderbilt University and Florida Atlantic University to support students pursuing careers in teaching with special emphasis on reading education.

Mr. Patterson has also established ReadKiddoread.com, his website which helps adults find books that kids will love. In addition, he has donated thousands of books to troops overseas.

Mr. Patterson has also established James Patterson Scholarships at Manhattan College, Vanderbilt University, and Florida Atlantic University, which provides scholarship support to future teachers in an effort to strengthen his mission to get children excited about reading.

Mr. Patterson has sustained achievement of lasting significance, and I strongly recommend Mr. Patterson for this honor. Mr. Patterson's accomplishments as a writer are extensive and provide evidence of outstanding achievements in his field. Additionally, he has also established himself as a writer interested in influencing the development of students who are readers and writers. To this end, he has partnered with several universities to develop scholarships that support the promotion of literacy. He is the first author to have #1 new titles simultaneously on *The New York Times* adult and children's bestsellers lists.

Has had nineteen consecutive #1 New York Times bestselling novels.

Holds the *New York Times* record for most Hardcover Fiction bestselling titles by a single author (76 total), which is also a *Guinness World Record*.

His critically acclaimed Maximum Ride series debuted on the New York Times bestsellers list at #1 and remained there for twelve straight weeks. The series has so far made ninety-four cumulative appearances on The New York Times bestsellers lists, proving that kids of all ages love page turners. He is also the creator of the #1 new detective series of the past five years, featuring Lindsay Boxer and the <u>Women's Murder Club</u>, from which the ABC television drama series was adapted. He has authored books behind six films on the Hollywood fast-track, including the upcoming *Maximum Ride* movie forthcoming from Avi Arad, the producer of X-Men and Spiderman.

He is the author of novels — from <u>The Thomas Berryman Number</u> (1976) to <u>Honeymoon</u> (2005) — that have won awards including the Edgar, the BCA Mystery Guild's Thriller of the Year, the International Thriller of the Year award, and the Reader's Digest Reader's Choice Award. And, he has won a Children's Choice Book Council's Children's Choice Awards "Author of the Year" award (2010).

He is one of Forbes magazine's Celebrity 100.

Patterson has made a guest appearance on the popular FOX TV show "The Simpsons" in March, 2007. He has also appeared in various episodes of "Castle" as himself.

Maximum Ride: the angel experiment by James Patterson (Book)

105 editions published between 2003 and 2011 in 5 languages and held by 3,788 libraries worldwide

After the mutant Erasers abduct the youngest member of their group, the "bird kids," who are the result of genetic experimentation, take off in pursuit and find themselves struggling to understand their own origins and purpose.

2nd chance: a novel by James Patterson(Book)

95 editions published between 1999 and 2009 in 19 languages and held by 3,743 libraries worldwide

2nd Chance reconvenes the Women's Murder Club, four friends (a detective, a reporter, an assistant district attorney, and a medical examiner) who used their networking skills, feminine intuition, and professional wiles to solve a baffling series of murders in 1st to Die. This time, the murders of two African Americans, a little girl and an old woman, bear all the signs of a serial killer for Lindsay Boxer, newly promoted to lieutenant of San Fransisco's homicide squad. But there's an odd detail she finds even more disturbing: both victims were related to city cops.

4th of July: a novel by James Patterson(Book)

68 editions published between 2004 and 2009 in 13 languages and held by 3,741 libraries worldwide

After losing one of its own, Lindsay Boxer and the Women' Murder Club make a courageous return for their fourth and most chilling case ever--one that could easily be their last. A young girl is killed in crossfire after a routine arrest goes terribly wrong, and Lt. Lindsay Boxer has to defend herself against a charge of police brutality. In a landmark trial that transfixes the nation, Lindsay fights to save her career and her sanity. While awaiting trial, Lindsay escapes to the beautiful town of Half Moon Bay, but the peaceful community there is reeling from a string of unspeakable murders. Working with her friends in the Women's Murder Club, Lindsay finds a link between these killings and a case she worked on years before--an unsolved murder that has haunted her ever since. As summer comes into full swing, Lindsay battles for her life on two fronts: before a judge and jury as her trial comes to a climax, and facing unknown adversaries who will do anything to keep her from the truth about the killings--including killing again. Healthy patients are dying of unknown causes in a San Francisco hospital, and the Women's Murder Club decides to investigate the hospital's personnel. They discover a hospital administrator determined to shield the hospital's reputation.

Honeymoon: a novel by James Patterson(Book)

88 editions published between 1999 and 2010 in 17 languages and held by 3,715 libraries worldwide

When a number of rich men come to a mysterious end, and a young investment banker dies of a supposed heart attack, FBI agent John O'Hara believes it is the work of a cold-blooded killer. Turning his eye to the only witness - the young banker's beautiful and secretive widow - O'Hara thinks he's closing in, but he's not sure whether he's pursuing justice or his own fatal obsession.

3rd degree: a novel by James Patterson(Book)

86 editions published between 2001 and 2009 in 16 languages and held by 3,715 libraries worldwide

Detective Lindsay Boxer is jogging along a beautiful San Francisco street when a fiery explosion rips through the neighborhood. A town house owned by an Internet millionaire is immediately engulfed in flames, and when Lindsay plunges inside to search for survivors, she finds three people dead. An infant who lived in the house cannot be found--and a mysterious message at the scene leaves Lindsay and the San Francisco Police Department completely baffled.

The big bad wolf: a novel by James Patterson(Book)

At the outset of his career with the FBI, Alex Cross is instructed to track down a band of kidnappers who are snatching people and possibly selling them into slavery, a case that is complicated by a terrible threat to Cross's own family.
