Brief Description:

Intramural Sports Supervisors are responsible for direct supervision of the Intramural Sport Programs including facilities, equipment, officials and participants. This includes on-site management of activities at the Recreation & Fitness Center, Henderson Field, the Track & Field Complex (including Tennis and Beach Volleyball Courts), and the Recreational Tennis Courts.

Key Accountabilities:

Reports to Sport Programs Coordinator

- Oversee program participants and officials during assigned shifts in accordance with established sports policies and procedures
- Ensure safety of Intramural Sports participants, officials, facility, & equipment
- Assist with pre-game meetings and officials' clinics
- Perform pre- and post-game logistics and administrative functions including checking in teams
- Manage designated activity spaces and ensure games are completed in a timely manner
- Provide feedback to officials throughout the season
- Assist with inventory and maintenance of Intramural Sports equipment
- Complete documentation including shift reports, accident/incident reports, and employee accountability forms
- Respond to accidents and incidents in accordance with the Emergency Action Plan
- Educate participants on Campus Recreation policies and proactively address policy violations and unsportsmanlike conduct
- Attend all required meetings and trainings
- Continue to work as an Intramural Sports Official
- Be prepared to step in and officiate in the event of missing official
- Maintain efficient and legible form documentation
- Assist with marketing tables and overall promotion of Sport Programs and Campus Recreation
- Perform other duties as assigned

Requirements:

- Current FAU student and enrolled in at least 6 credits at time of application
- Have a GPA of 2.5 or greater at time of application
- Authorized to work in the United States
- Previous work experience as an Intramural Sports Official
- First Aid/CPR certified (or capable of obtaining shortly after appointment)

 - o Prioritize tasks with a focus on relational service
 - Maintain high standards and achieve high expectations
 - Submit regular availability and attend required meetings trainings
 - Document employees for positive or negative performance as necessary
