Stephen W. Miller is the Deputy Director for the University Consortium of Intermodal Transportation Safety and Security at Florida Atlantic University's College of Engineering and Computer Science. Primary duties include operations oversight with the Director, project management, and new program development with industry and government. Stephen is currently directing two projects he co-wrote with Jack Selter, Director of the University of Central Florida, Center for Advanced Transportation Systems Simulation funded by the Florida Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration. The first project is civilian applications of unmanned aerial vehicles in pre and post disaster situations and the other project is a Virtual Weigh in Motion System for port applications. On behalf of FAU, Stephen created a strategic partnership with the Johns Hopkins University-Center for Emergency Preparedness and Response conducting applied research to disaster related issues. He is also working with projects at Port Everglades, the Port of Jacksonville, the Port of Palm Beach and the Port of Miami.

Stephen was previously at the University of Central Florida, College of Engineering, in the Center for Advanced Transportation Systems Simulation (CATSS). While there, in close partnership with the Florida Department of Transportation, he directed the first International Conference in Virtual Weigh in Motion at Disney World as well as the National Conference for Transportation Safety and Security. He also wrote the contract with the North American Transportation Management Institute for national certification programs. He was a university representative to the Florida Trucking Association. Before leaving, Stephen designed projects for both CATSS and the new FAU UCITSS Center.

Mr. Miller has been at Florida Atlantic University for 17 years and prior to his latest position, was the Associate Dean of Continuing Education overseeing government and industry based training and Associate Dean of Students for the Broward Campuses.

He holds a Master's degree in higher education administration and a Bachelor of Science degree in mass communications both from Florida State University. Honors include Who's Who in America, Who's Who in the South and Southwest, Past National President of A Child is Missing, Kiwanian of the Year, Past President of the Macon Kiwanis Club, and Proclamation from City of Hollywood, Florida. He still sits on the Board of Directors for the Florida Board of American College Testing. He was formerly with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and a Deputy with the St. Lucie Sheriff's Department.
