



POLICY ON OUT-OF STATE ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

1. **Award Process.** Out-of-state academic scholarships may be awarded to incoming students who meet the following conditions:
 - A. Student shall be admitted to the Harriet L. Wilkes Honors College.
 - B. Student shall have a minimum grade point average of 3.5 from their previous institution.
 - C. Student shall not be eligible for in-state tuition rates. If a student later becomes eligible for in-state tuition, it is important to inform the Office of Admissions as soon as possible so that the unneeded waiver can be re-awarded to another student.
 - D. Non-US citizens must be permanent residents or have a valid I20 and F1 status.

2. **Scholarship Allocation.** Scholarships apply to the differential costs between the out-of-state and the in-state portion of tuition fees. They are awarded for a certain number of credit hours (e.g. 12 or 24) per academic year.

3. **Renewal Process.** An annual review will take place at the end of the spring term. Scholarships may be renewed under the following conditions:
 - A. Student is enrolled full-time in the Honors College and makes satisfactory degree progress (minimum of 24 earned credits per academic year).
 - B. Student has not exceeded the number of terms specified in the original award letter.
 - C. Student maintains a 3.3 FAU grade point average.
