Check in with your student



Make a positive first impression with students, to build rapport and create a safe and welcoming space.

- How are you doing?
- How is the semester going for you?
- Any highlights or challenges you care to share?

Learn their perspective

- How are you doing in your program and courses?
- If there was one thing that would make your education better, what would that be?
- What has surprised you about your program or coursework so far?



Ask generative, open-ended questions that help advisers learn about students' strengths, skills, and abilities.

Learn about their dream



Inquire about students' hopes and dreams for their futures.

- What do you want to do when you finish your program?
- What's your dream job?

Identify where they are and where they need to go

- Review Degree Audit Report (DAR)
- Identify next steps



Students and advisers co-create a plan for making students' dreams a reality.

Encourage and support your student



Students deliver on the plan co-created during the Design phase, and advisers are available to encourage and support their students.

- Remind them they've got this
- Provide them with a way to contact you and the hours you are available.
- Ask if there is anything you can do to help them find success

Hold them accountable

- Have them tell you what their plan for success is going forward.
- Ask them to set a goal for this semester and next.



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
