The Dean updated faculty that we haven't changed specific programs, rather we are reporting with what we have, and courses are required per accreditation process. Our course titles and requirements for COE will not be changed at this time.

Assessment

Dr. Brewer updated the faculty on assessment information across each Department. The FAU Elementary Education program was ranked number 1 in the state, for the third time. Math Education was also ranked number 1 this year. For retention and recruitment, there is a document that will go out after this meeting in hopes of voting at next meeting. The Director of Accreditation, Assessment and Analytics—Dr. Sheila Walden, was introduced to the faculty.

Dr. Catto announced a document that is being put together that highlights the partnerships between FAU and student organizations.

Drs. Reyes Guerra, Sembiante, and Barakat received a large research grant. Project---Preparing for Readiness & Academic Improvement for pre-School ELs

Continuing Business:

Promotion/Tenure Committee Update Dr. Pat Maslin-Ostrowski

Dr. Maslin Ostrowski summarized and updated the Promotion and Tenure Committee processes that have been occurring regarding getting faculty feedback for the PT committee. The goal is to create a revised document that meets the needs of the faculty. Reps will share back the revised document, with track changes, and will seek additional input from faculty. This will come back to the P/T Ad hoc COE committee. As soon as there is a document that meets criteria and has been updated to reflect faculty input, we will share with the faculty once more and faculty should discuss at the dept level and bring forward their concerns to the Ad Hoc committee. The new document will be shared via FA and then at a subsequent meeting there will be vote. Dr. Maslin Ostrowski reviewed procedural actions from the university committee. It was discussed that there will be a special FA meeting to view the document and at the last FA, there will be a vote. Update COE Constitution to align with University Bylaws 11:15-11:20 The updated COE constitution was shared. We will vote on the Updated COE constitution at the next FA meeting.

OURI Updates/Initiatives, Dr. Sharon Darling 11:20-11:30 Dr. Darling updated the faculty on ways they can get undergraduate research incorporated into their courses as well as the OURI initiatives across the university. She encouraged faculty to get involved in these initiatives.

Dean's Talking Points

Dean Silverman shared that at the state APR, FAU was above 3, which is excellent. We had the highest mean overall of any university in the state. Dr. Brewer and his team were thanked for gathering these data. FAU has won the Holmes program of the year for and that will be announced at the Annual AACTE meeting.

The Dean announced Dr. Brady's donation to ACI and the Special Education Dept.

The Dean thanked Dr. Pat Maslin Ostrowski for leading the Ad hoc committee on the P/T guidelines.

The Dean discussed the Annual review process. There were some concerns from faculty regarding the process and way criteria have been established. A faculty member reminded us that P/T is faculty governance. The Dean discussed we need to help faculty to meet P/T expectations.

APR---Dean reminded faculty that APR reviewers are here to provide report and suggestions, it is not for accreditation. Talk about what types of supports are needed in your Dept.

Dean discussed he would be happy to discuss research and stats support as a faculty incentive. He discussed availability and partnership with districts to support their research.

Chat GPT was brought to faculty's attention. It was reminded to faculty that when the news contacts them, you can speak, but clearly articulate you are speaking on your own, not on behalf of FAU. It was told you should contact Peter Hull, (Media outreach), prior to speaking on whatever topic.

A motion was made by Dr. Scott and seconded by Dr. Salinas to adjourn the meeting. Meeting ended at 12pm.
