
FAU TREASURE COAST MASTER PLAN

SUPPORT FACILITIES ELEMENT

Goal 1

To ensure provision of support facilities to meet the needs of the campus.

Objective 1A

Provide support facilities to support the mission of the University and to keep pace with the demands generated by enrollment growth.

Policy 1A-1

Conduct studies of food service operations by the end of 2002 to ensure increased availability and variety as the campus population increases.

Policy 1A-2

Conduct studies of child care operations by the end of 2004 to ensure appropriate availability and variety of services to the campus population.

Policy 1A-3

Develop procedures by the end of 2002 to ensure proper input for design of recreation facilities, by including input from the student body and the Recreation, Facilities, and Grounds departments.

Policy 1A-4

Amend the adopted campus master plan as necessary to include the results of studies conducted in 1A-1 thru 1A-3.

Policy 1A-5

Fund support facilities based on legislatively allocated and PECO funding processes. At the same time, actively seek alternative or additional private funding for new support facilities.

Policy 1A-6

Support facilities shall be located as shown in **Figure MP.1 and MP.2**.

Policy 1A-7

Commence/complete support facilities projects contained in the 10-year Capital Improvements Schedule for the Treasure Coast Campus (see **Capital Improvements Element 14**).

Objective 1B

Construct new support facilities including intramural, and casual-use athletic facilities to support the mission of the University and to keep pace with the demands generated by enrollment growth.

Policy 1B-1

Commence/complete support projects contained in the 10-year Capital Improvements Schedule for the Treasure Coast Campus (see **Capital Improvements Element 14**).

Policy 1B-2

Seek CITF funding for new recreation facilities.

Policy 1B-3

As part of the initial Joint Use Facility project, construct a portion of the casual-use athletic facilities in keeping with the available CITF funds. Such facilities might include a basketball court, a tennis court, a volleyball court and/or general open space.

Policy 1B-4

The University will establish a list of specific intramural and casual-use recreational facilities and a schedule for their development in keeping with the pace of residential development and the growth of Branch Campus enrollment. The master plan will be amended to include the results of the plan.

Policy 1B-5

The University will establish appropriate support facility priorities in the Fixed Capital Outlay Budget Request (PECO List).

Policy 1B-6

The University will establish, and update as necessary, a consolidated support facility priority listing to combine all new support facility construction programs, whatever the source of funding.

Policy 1B-7

The University's President, in conjunction with the University Architect, Vice President for Northern Campuses or their designee, with the assistance of the Facilities Planning Department will develop an annual program that addresses the allocation of funds for the development of future support facilities.

Policy 1B-8

The University will encourage energy efficiency and conservation techniques in all future facilities with the intent to meet or exceed the state energy design guidelines.

Policy 1B-9

Locate unforeseen facilities (arising from grant awards or other circumstances) according to schematic sites and zones as delineated on the master graphic, **Figure MP.1 and MP.2**. Amendments to the plan that alone, or in conjunction with other plan amendments, exceed the thresholds established in s.240.155(9), F.S., shall be reviewed and adopted pursuant to ss.240.155(6)-(8), F.S. Further, amendments that do not exceed these thresholds shall be consolidated into a single annual submission and submitted to the Office of Capital Improvements for review and approval (see Rules 6C-21.103(2)-(3), F.A.C.).

Objective 1C

Properly maintain recreation and athletic facilities.

Policy 1C-1

Institute a student recreation fee to support Recreation Department operations.

Policy 1C-2

Establish revised procedures and funding to maintain recreational facilities.
