Elementary Education Major

NOTE: *To be admitted to a Teacher Education program, students must do the following:*

1. Have a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale on the lower division undergraduate general education component or have completed requirements for a baccalaureate degree with a minimum GPA of 2.5 from any college or university accredited by a regional accrediting institution;
2. Complete or satisfy CLAST requirement;
3. Pass all sections of the General Knowledge (GK) test
3. Meet the general university requirements for admission;
4. Be interviewed and recommended for admission;
5. Be programmed by an assigned adviser; and
6. Be approved for admission by the College of Education

NOTE: All Elementary Education majors entering the program in Fall 1997 or later are required to enroll in courses in a prescribed sequence with specific prerequisites. In order to receive appropriate advising, students must be admitted to the College of Education and programmed during the first semester of the junior year. Students completing the Elementary Education degree program will be eligible for an ESOL Endorsement upon graduation.
