3. Pass all sections of the General Knowledge (GK) test
4. Meet the general university requirements for admission;
5. Make a formal application to a Teacher Preparation Program in the College of Education;
6. Be approved for admission by the concerned dept. and the College of Education;
7. Be programmed before Spring of Jr year by an assigned advisor.
