**ENGLISH COMPOSITION** (6 credits, two courses, **Gordon Rule, C or better**)

**ENC 1101 College Writing 1 (3 credits) - REQUIRED**

**ENC 1102 College Writing 2 (3 credits) - REQUIRED** (ENC 1101 is a prerequisite)

**MATHEMATICS** (6 credits minimum, two courses from the following list, **Gordon Rule, C or better**)

**(MUST TAKE A PLACEMENT TEST BEFORE REGISTERING FOR MATH COURSES)**

MAC 1105 & L College Algebra (3 credits) (*waived if ready to take MAC 2233*) will count as elective credits

**MAC 2233 Methods of Calculus (3 credits) - REQUIRED** (Health Admin majors have an alternative option)

**STA 2023 & L Introductory Statistics (3 credits) - REQUIRED**

**For Bachelor of Science (BS) Degree:** (option not available for Health Administration majors)

Students must complete 6 *additional hours* of higher mathematics and/or statistics beyond the business program's requirements (MAC 2233, STA 2023, & Business Core). Some examples of courses that would fulfill this requirement include: ECO 4421, ECO 4422, ECO 4401, ECO 4402, MAC 2311, 2312, 2313, &/or PHI 3132.

**ELECTIVES** (15-18 credits) **Varies with major & degree** (Includes additional Mathematics and Foreign Language credits)

----- Free electives - in any college/dept, including Business, not previously taken - needed to meet min. 120 cr. for Bachelor's Degree.

## FOREIGN LANGUAGE, MAJOR COURSES and COLLEGE REQUIREMENTS

### FOREIGN LANGUAGE

Foreign language is **NOT** required. Note: Minimum 2 years high school For. Lang. is required.

**EXCEPTIONS: REQUIRED for students majoring in International Business and Trade (0-8 credits), General Economics (0-8 credits), or International Economics (0-8 credits):** Students with more than one year of foreign language in high school should enroll in *Beginning Language & Culture 2* (FRE/GER/GRE/GRK/LAT/JPN/ITA/SPN/HBR 1121) or a higher-level course. Students can earn proficiency for a first-level course by successfully completing a second-level course. For questions related to this requirement, consult an academic advisor.

*Native Speakers of a foreign language may consult the Languages & Linguistics dept. regarding proficiency. CLEP exam credits meet requirement, see catalog.*

**CLAST:** Satisfy the College Level Academic Skills Test (CLAST) - check catalog for options

**Students must be admitted to a major (upper-division) to take 3000/4000 level Business courses. See the admissions standards at the end of this document.**
