The College of Nursing requires 60 credits minimum of upper division course work (3000 level or above).

The College of Nursing is a limited access program. Qualified applicants will be admitted on a space available basis. Students must meet the university admission requirements and have a minimum 3.0 G.P.A. for admission as a pre-professional nursing major. Admission to the university as a pre-professional nursing major does not automatically admit the student to the professional phase of the program. To be considered for the professional phase of the program, the student must be admitted to FAU as a pre-professional nursing major by 11/30 (Boca campus) and 4/1 (PSL campus) of the year prior to commencement of the professional phase of the program of the respective campus. In addition, students must complete an on-line college inquiry form and letter of intent (see [www.fau.edu/nursing](http://www.fau.edu/nursing)). A minimum GPA of 3.0 (calculated on all undergraduate courses completed) and a minimum grade of "C" is required. IFP classes, prerequisites, and pre-professional nursing courses are required. If there are more qualified applicants than available spaces in the professional phase, the following factors are considered in the selection process:

- ❖ Overall GPA (calculated based on all undergraduate courses completed), minimum GPA 3.0
- ❖ Minimum of 12 prerequisite courses completed including all science courses (by end of Fall Semester for Boca program and Spring semester for PSL)
- ❖ Grades in science courses and performance in other prerequisites
- ❖ Native student status at FAU
- ❖ Nursing Entrance Exam Score
- ❖ Other pertinent factors related to the professional role

There are additional requirements including health insurance, a federal background check, and an examination prior to entering the professional phase of the program.
