



EARLY ADMIT PROGRAM FOR FLORIDA HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Information for A. D. Henderson High School Students (FAU High)

Early Admissions/Special Processes for Admissions, Registration, and Advising

Rationale: Florida Statutes provide for dual enrollment of high school students in university courses and for a specialized form of dual enrollment entitled Early Admissions. (§1007.271 F.S., §1007.272 F.S., §1011.62(i)F.S.). The FAU High School is a formalized mechanism to recruit, admit, support and administer an intensive high school student dual enrollment program of up to four years on the university campus. The program provides students with rigorous academic studies, broad extracurricular activities and direct opportunities to explore university involvement.

- Apply early in the 11th grade to school personnel (guidance counselor)
- Declare intent to graduate from high school or high school and university
- If intent is to graduate from high school but be an early admission student for senior year follow process below:
 - ✓ Submit Application to FAU as degree seeking student – Application is available online (Application are accepted for the fall term).
 - ✓ Declare intended major – can be undeclared (Academic Advising will be through the intended college/major department).
 - ✓ Submit all documents (transcripts, ACT/SAT scores etc.)
 - ✓ Letters of recommendation
 - ✓ Must be a Florida resident

Depending on the student's GPA, an admission decision may wait until 6th semester grades have been received.

Upon admission into early admission program an Orientation hold will be placed on FAU high school student's record. Students should contact Orientation office to have hold removed.

If you have over 30 credits and have a declared major, upon acceptance into early admission program pursue advisement from intended/declared college for fall and spring semester. Please remember that the colleges usually will not advise unless the student has been admitted as a degree seeking student.

After advisement and registration, bring your schedule to Freshman Advising office (SU 201) to process tuition waiver.

Contact your guidance counselor in high school for processing your book voucher.

Parking decal waiver will have to be processed through your high school for fall and spring semester.
