



EARLY ADMIT PROGRAM FOR FLORIDA HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

What courses can be taken by Early Admission Students?

Early Admission students priority is to fulfill the high school graduation requirements. Courses can be spread out between the fall and spring semesters. In addition students may enroll in courses required to fulfill their major requirements at FAU. FAU's general education requirement and curriculum requirements by major are available at http://www.fau.edu/freshmanadvising/curriculum_sheets.php. Students are eligible to enroll into most 1000 and 2000 level classes. Please make sure that you have met all prerequisites and/or corequisite before requesting to register for the classes. Early Admission students may only register for classes that are pre-approved by their high school guidance counselor on the Registration/Permission form and by FAU Early Admission advisor.

NOTE: Any student who registers for a class that has not been approved by the high school guidance counselor and FAU advisor will have to agree to pay for the course(s) or will be dropped without notice.

How many credits can be taken by Early Admission students each semester?

Early admission students will have to be registered full time (12 credits) to be eligible to be in the program. Early Admission students are allowed to take a minimum of 12 credits and a maximum of 18 credit hours.
