## **Nanjing, China** **FAU - YISA China PROGRAM** **Spring/Fall 2010**

Nanjing is a “medium” sized city of six million people offering students a rich history, modern economy, and comfortable atmosphere. Yisa’s program is located on the campus of Nanjing Normal University, in the heart of downtown Nanjing, near hundreds of restaurants, historical sites, department stores, parks, and other points of interest. **Program Dates:** Spring 2010: February 15 to May 28  
Fall 2010: August 30 to December 17

**Living Accommodations:**

- **Apartment:** A shared, furnished apartment in an attractive complex just a 10 minute walk to campus. Apartments include a small kitchen, TV, internet access, and a washing machine. Weekly housekeeping and laundry services can be added for a small additional cost.
- **Home stay with Nanjing family:** YISA will work to place you with a host family. Most Chinese host families will have a school age child. The children will most likely speak English but their parents will not. Chinese will be the primary language spoken at home. Family includes you in some of the meals and may live farther from home. Home stays placements cannot be guaranteed for all students

**Program Fee:** Students pay \$7,950 for Fall or Spring semester and 12 credits FAU tuition (in state/out of state rates apply). Program fee includes books, health insurance, housing, high speed internet access, excursions to Beijing, Shanghai, and other locations including entry fees to field trip destinations, cell phone for calls within China, support services provided by faculty and staff (including but not limited to translation assistance, travel planning, academic advising, and emergency assistance), pick-up at airport upon arrival in China, pre-departure and onsite orientation.

Students applying through FAU may use their Bright Futures Scholarship towards in-state tuition costs. Federal & State financial aid also may be used for this program.

**Not Included:** Airfare (est. \$1,300), FAU application fee/basic insurance/ISIC card (\$100), meals, visa/passport, and spending money (est. \$70 per week).
