## Dublin, Ireland

### Exchange Program Dublin Institute of Technology

Dublin, capital of Ireland, is one of Europe's top urban hotspots. This youthful city pulsates with a compelling mix of history, culture, and hip shops. Dublin is vibrant, cosmopolitan and is a truly captivating city. The city of Dublin is surrounded by unspoiled countryside with authentic rural life, breathtaking scenery, and a fascinating heritage just waiting to be discovered.

The Dublin Institute of Technology (DIT) is a member of the European University Association and is Ireland's largest higher educational institution with over 22,000 students. It has a city centre location, small group teaching and one-to-one contact between staff and students. DIT offers a wide range of clubs and societies, everything from sporting to the social, cultural through to the curious, hobbies through to humanitarian. **Program Dates:** Fall semester: September 1, 2009 to January 25, 2010  
Spring semester: February 1, 2010 to June 21, 2010

**Academic Program:** This program is open to all FAU students however, the courses offered on the DIT exchange are business courses. DIT is the largest business school in Ireland and the Faculty of Business is the largest business faculty in Ireland, encompassing five distinct schools: School of Accounting and Finance, School of Management Studies, School of Marketing, and School of Retail and Service Management. Courses are instructed in English.

**Courses:** Business & Management, International Business, and Marketing

**Program Fee:** Students pay FAU tuition and overseas living expenses.

**Estimated Costs:** Airfare, FAU tuition (in state/out of state rates apply), FAU application fee/basic insurance/ISIC card (\$100), The estimated cost of living in Dublin for 1 month is €1000 Euros. Students may find the monthly estimates to be high or low depending on their personal choices. This is the breakdown of the estimated cost of living for one month: meals (€91), accommodations (€33), utilities (€5), travel (€3), books (€0), and miscellaneous (€163). Household goods to furnish accommodation (approx. €300) upon arrival.

**Living Accommodations:** DIT does not have on-campus accommodations, but has secured spaces in private student accommodation in Dublin. Griffith Halls of Residence is a high quality student accommodation located on the grounds of Griffith College Dublin.
