## Germany - Switzerland Reformation Tour

### Summer Term II

(Overseas Portion May 28 – June 13, 2010)

A study tour of major places in the history of the Reformation starts in the once-divided city of Berlin where you will visit the Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church, Tiergarten, Olympic Stadium and other sites. The program also includes travel to Wittenberg, (where the Reformation began), Eisleben (birthplace of Martin Luther), Heidleberg (stronghold of German Reformed Protestant movement), Augsburg (with its cathedral dating from 994), Mainz (where the printing press was invented), Worms (where Luther made his stand against the Catholic Church), Zurich (refuge for many English Protestants during the reign of Queen Mary), Bern (scenic Alpine pass) and Geneva (home to Calvin's Reformation).

**Eligibility Requirements:** Program is open to undergraduate and graduate students with a 2.0 GPA or higher.

**Course Description:** EUH 4930/HIS 5909: Luther, Calvin and the Early Reformation (3 credits)

This course will introduce students to the Europe of the early Protestant Reformation with a focus on the major reformers and their ideas. The course starts May 17 with several sessions in Boca Raton before going overseas May 28<sup>th</sup>. Students will submit a paper and take a final exam upon returning to the U.S.

**Program Fee:** Estimated from \$4,870

**Program Fee Includes:** Airfare (R/T Miami to Berlin), three-star hotels (double occupancy), tour escort, continental breakfasts, six dinners, excursions, entrance fees and tours, airport transfers, basic health insurance, International Student ID Card, pre-departure orientation, and on-site support staff.

**Program Fee Does Not Include:** FAU tuition (out-of-state tuition extra), most meals, books, and spending money.
