- b. She also discussed the Graduate Stipend Workgroup report that was endorsed by the University Graduate Council.
 - Provost Perry announced to University Faculty Senate that no recurring monies for graduate students were received in this FY 17-18 budget; thus, funding for insurance or recurring stipend increases this fiscal year will not happen. Dr. Floyd emphasized that Dr. Perry

requested funds and indicated that he is hopeful recurring funding will be allocated in the near future.

- She announced that Graduate Assistants who are employed and receiving tuition waivers this Fall (2017) term will receive a one-time nonrecurring allocation of \$800.00 in their December paycheck.
- c. Dr. Floyd also announced that some of the Financial Aid fee money graduate students pay may be used beginning next year for a new a merit and need based fellowship program. The details about eligibility, processes and the name is forthcoming.
