All action agenda items were approved by the Council without objection, with one abstention and will now move to the Steering Committee and on to the University Faculty Senate. The action agenda was held up pending a review of the College of Business proposal by the College of Engineering and their approval with memo. The memo was received and all was approved.

It was agreed by consensus that the Council was disappointed in the College of Medicine's untimely presentation of new and changed courses for review. In the future, the College should submit all necessary new programs and changes to the GPC and UGC on time which is consistent with expectations of all colleges.

### VI. Updates: Graduate Tuition Benefits Proposed Policy Change

Dr. Rosson clarified that Summer Graduate Assistants must have some type of appointment with a minimum of ten hours per week to receive a tuition waiver. The 12-12-12 version of the policy will be adjusted with minor changes for clarification and posted on the Graduate College Website. All members of the Council will receive an electronic copy. The policy will be implemented in the Fall 2013 semester. There are still questions about non-academic graduate assistants and Dr. Floyd encouraged the university to ensure that all graduate assistants, including non-teaching GA's, have an equal opportunity to benefit from the tuition waivers.

### VII. Graduate Faculty Status

The College of Education Dean, Dr. Rosson, Dr. Floyd and others met about their Graduate Faculty Levels A, B and C. It was agreed that a Form 1 will be used in the future for these appointments (indicating the level and date of approval) to ensure that the Graduate College has the necessary records for processing. How renewals will be processed, per the University Governance Document and the COE Document will be determined by 12/31/14.

Dr. Rosson clarified that once a university faculty member has a Form 1 completed and approved the faculty member should be able to serve as a Graduate Faculty person in a different college and the Council members present seemed to agree. Of course, colleges and programs may have unique requirements for service on dissertation and thesis committees. A topic for consideration next year is the timing of renewals and due process for faculty.

## VIII. Updates:

It was agreed that the structure of the schedule for the GPC and UGC meetings next year will remain the same. Dr. Poulson and Dr. Floyd agreed to be available over the summer for the Catalog Sub-Committee work and to convene the meetings of the GPC and UGC in August. They will continue as chairs until the 2013-2014 elections are held.
