PRODUCING SCHOLARLY PUBLICATIONS

Writing is an important part of a graduate student's intellectual and professional development. Participants will learn best practices for managing writing time as a graduate student; systems for planning, composing, revising and editing; and strategies for seeking publication. This workshop will focus on writing conference and journal papers, strategies for converting seminar papers and/or dissertation chapters into publishable articles, creating a web presence, and producing book reviews and editorials.

DEVELOPING THESES & DISSERTATIONS

This workshop will help students plan, research, write, revise, and edit a thesis or dissertation. The planning portion of the workshop will focus on academic timelines, committee selection, proposals, and writing cycles. Participants will learn note-taking strategies and technologies for documenting research. The writing portion of the workshop will range from strategies for composing a proposal, introduction, abstract, or problem statement to efficient practices for revising, editing and polishing the final product.
