Biographical Information: **Dr. DeRosa** is a Professor of Political Science at FAU, and has lectured throughout the U.S. and in Europe. He has authored numerous journal articles, professional reviews and several books, including “*The Confederacy and the Redemption of American Democracy.*” He is a member of several professional organizations, including a Salvatori Fellow and a founding member of The Academy of Philosophy and Letters. **Arnold R. Beckhardt** is a retired IBM engineer who specialized in the development of military weapons systems and space programs. He was a pilot in World War II in China, Burma, and India, and has published NACA technical reports and magazine articles. He lives with his wife Greta in Vero Beach, Fl. In 2007, Mr. Beckhardt published “*Turnaround,*” his first “Roy Neely” novel, at age 85. His second “Neely” novel, “*Goering’s Gold*” was published in 2008, and his third, “*Black Gold,*” in Sept. 2009.

“Viva Domingo: A Celebration of 40 Years at the Met”

Instructor: Giuseppe Albanese

Course Description: From that moment on September 28, 1969, when he substituted for an indisposed Franco Corelli, Placido Domingo has been a fixture at the Metropolitan Opera with 45 roles and over 640 performances to his credit (and still counting.) Maestro Albanese has chosen four memorable productions featuring Domingo in the lead tenor role, over the twenty year period from 1977 to 1989, showcasing his amazing versatility. Highlights from these classic operas, shown in chronological order, will trace the remarkable career of this exceptional musical artist.

2. “MANON LESCAUT” – By Puccini
3. “TURANDOT” – By Puccini
4. “AIDA” – By Verdi

Biographical Information: Heralded by his students as a “dynamic and learned scholar of the opera,” Giuseppe Albanese received his degree in history from the University of Vermont. In 1990, after five years of intensive study, he developed and began teaching “The Joy of Opera,” a course that garnered accolades from Lifelong Learning students. Maestro Albanese was the recipient of the Lifelong Learning Excellence in Teaching Award in 2000, the 2002 LLS Faculty Appreciation Award (Jupiter campus), and was named the Brandeis National Women’s Committee “Man of Achievement” in 2004.

***“Resources, Politics and Power:
The Impact of Oil, Money and Vital Resources on Politics and War”***

Instructor: Richard Hill, Ph.D.

Course Description: For centuries, governments have waged wars for the purpose of gaining military power and security, much of which is derived through control over various economic “sinews.” Many great accounts of conquest have been based on the “imperial value” of these vital material resources, and this trend has continued into the twentieth and twenty-first centuries. Throughout this unique course, Prof. Hill will examine the causes and consequences of several such historic conflicts, and ask if a coherent cost/benefit analysis can be applied to these “resource wars.”

Four Sessions:

1. WW1: Overseas Empires Linked by the First Oil-Burning Fleets
2. WW2: The Rise of Air Power and Gasoline
3. The Cold War: The Repeated Crises of Oil and the Balance of Power
4. The War on Terror: Middle East Oil, Security and WMD’s

Biographical Information: Richard F. Hill has a Ph.D. in history from Georgetown University, Washington D.C., and an M.A. in history from Georgia State University, Atlanta, Ga., specializing in U.S. diplomatic and foreign policy history. He is the author of one book and several articles that take a new and sometimes controversial look at his field. As such, the questions he asks provoke student questions and debate, both of which he welcomes enthusiastically. He is currently an Adjunct Professor of History at several universities and colleges in our area, including FAU.

“Special Two-Part Lecture Series - About Laura (Riding) Jackson”

(Hosted by the FAU Lifelong Learning Society & the Laura (Riding) Jackson Foundation)

Instructor: Barrett Watten, Ph.D.

Laura Riding Jackson is a major but neglected American modernist poet, who produced a remarkable body of poetry, collected in 1938, that took lyric poetry to the limits of representation. In the late 1930s, Riding underwent a crisis of belief in poetry itself, placed her poetic oeuvre “under erasure,” and went on to produce a series of works that address the “truth” of language apart from poetry’s inadequacies. Settling in Wabasso, Florida, she produced new texts such as The Telling and, with her husband, co-authored a lengthy critique to the possibility of truth in language titled Rational Meaning: A New Foundation for the Definition of Words.

Two Sessions:

1. “Haunted by Possibility: Laura Riding’s Poetry and After” - Poet and critic Barrett Watten, one of several “language-centered” writers inspired by Laura Riding’s work, will introduce her poetic oeuvre, framed by her biography, and the reasons she felt she could not continue it.
2. “The House of Language: Laura (Riding) Jackson’s Rational Meaning and the Truth of Experience” Watten will present Jacksons’ little known project Rational Meaning on-site at the Wabasso house, preserved since her death in 1991, and where she and her husband completed the work. Seeking an intersection between language and house as “site,” Watten will explore the relationship between Riding’s critique of language and her life. (*Refreshments will be served.)

Biographical Information: Barrett Watten is Professor of English at Wayne State University. He is author of The Constructivist Moment: From Material Text to Cultural Poetics (winner of the 2003 René Wellek Prize) and numerous volumes of poetry, including Frame (1971-1990), Bad History, and Progress/Under Erasure. With Carrie Noland, he co-edited Diasporic Avant-Gardes: Experimental Poetics and Cultural Dislocation, based on the 2004 conference at UC Irvine, currently under review; and with Lyn Hejinian, he is co-editor of A Guide to Poetics Journal: Writing in the Expanded Field, 1982-98, forthcoming from Wesleyan University Press.

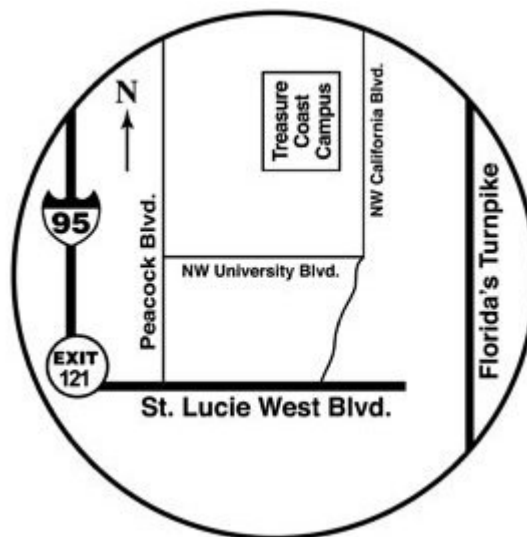
