GENERAL INFORMATION

As a United States citizen and Florida resident 60 years of age or older, you may attend Florida Atlantic University's undergraduate courses tuition-free on an audit basis when space is available. Florida residency is attained when you have lived in the State of Florida for at least twelve (12) consecutive months immediately prior to the first day of classes. Two forms of identification are required to verify Florida residency. Bring your Florida driver's license/photo ID and your Florida voter's identification card, including age and length of residence. Alternative forms of identification are your homestead documentation or your federal tax return showing a Florida address for the prior year.

Classroom space for 60+ Audit is based on availability after regular student registration. Contacting an instructor will not provide access to the course. There may be "empty seats," but still no space for 60+ Auditors. Credit students have priority. If the course fills with credit students, there will be no space available for 60+ Auditors. To ensure that all credit students are accommodated first, registration for 60+ Auditors takes place a few days after classes begin. This Schedule of Courses is **NOT** verification of the availability of the courses listed. However, only those courses listed in this schedule may be taken tuition-free for 60+ Audit if they are available.

Courses are held at the campus indicated in the schedule. Since space is limited, plan alternatives to your first choices. We ask that you register only for courses you plan to attend so that others will have the opportunity to register for the courses they wish to attend.

OWL CARD (FAU ID)

Participants are required to have an Owl Card (FAU photo ID), for which a one-time fee is assessed. More information provided at registration.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE AND REQUIREMENTS

1. **Tuesday, January 17, 2012**, is the **ONLY** day you may register for 60+ classes for spring.
2. You must register in person.
3. Registration begins at 8 a.m.
4. If there is a hold on your record, your course registration will not be processed until the hold is cleared.
5. **If you are a new 60+ Auditor, you will need:**
 - Non-degree application and fee of \$30
 - Non-degree residency form and documentation
 - Immunization form
 - Two forms of ID (see General Information)
 - Drop/Add form (given on the day of registration)

If you are a returning 60+ Auditor who has not registered in more than 12 months, you will need:

- Non-degree application
- Non-degree residency form and documentation
- Two forms of ID (see General Information)
- Drop/Add form (given on the day of registration)

If you are a returning 60+ Auditor who has registered within the past 12 months, you will need:

- Drop/Add form (given on the day of registration)
- Picture ID
