

Volunteer and Community Outreach

Florida Atlantic University and its administrators, faculty and students are committed to being good neighbors, and are deeply involved in a wide range of projects that help make South Florida a better place to live. In some cases, the volunteerism and outreach extend well beyond our backyard to help people in other parts of this country and in locales around the world.

Virtually every division and department is involved in volunteer work and community outreach. Since spring 2009, FAU students have provided almost 400,000 volunteer and service learning hours through 208 courses at the university. While such efforts proved invaluable in many instances, the work was worth in excess of \$2.8 million based on the prevailing Florida minimum wage. Faculty, staff and students participated in scores of other projects, contributing countless volunteer hours to give back to the community, and improve the quality of life in the region.

Much of the student volunteerism is coordinated through the Weppner Center for Civic Engagement & Services and Students Advocating Volunteer Involvement. Recently, students volunteered their time to the Children's Home Society, Memorial Regional Hospital and the Caridad Center,

which serves the migrant population in southern Palm Beach County. Students also participate regularly in food, clothing, book and blood drives.

Earlier this year, following tradition, a group of 23 student volunteers traveled to Tallahassee for their Alternate Spring Break. They visited a homeless shelter, where they learned about the plight of many residents, sorted donated clothing and cleaned the shelter's facilities and grounds. They played with children at a transitional housing shelter and prepared and served dinner for families housed there. Past Alternative Spring Break projects included assisting Hurricane Katrina victims in Louisiana; cleaning up national parks; volunteering in soup kitchens and after-care programs; and helping to build homes for Habitat for Humanity.

The Christine E. Schmidt College of Nursing and the Charles E. Schmidt School of Medicine are collaborating on a project that is having a major impact on South Florida. It is a low-cost program to help prevent elderly hospital patients discharged to nursing homes from being readmitted to the hospital because of complications. Based on a study of 25 nursing homes, the projected Medicare savings for a 100-bed facility is \$125,000 a year.

The College of Nursing's efforts extend across the country, as well. Since 2009, nine undergraduate classes have traveled to Oklahoma to provide health education and care for Cherokee children.

A number of FAU administrators and faculty members serve on the boards of community agencies. President Mary Jane Saunders, for example, serves on the boards of MedUTech, the Broward Workshop, Life Tech, the HBOI Foundation and the Broward Educational Consortium, among others.

Many FAU professors are making a difference in the community. Dr. Tim Steigenga, a professor of political science at the Harriett L. Wilkes Honors College on the MacArthur Campus, has been deeply involved in helping to serve the Mayan immigrant community in the Jupiter area. In 2006, he helped found El Sol, a neighborhood resource center, and he later co-founded a nonprofit organization, Corn Maya Inc., which provides services to the immigrant community in Palm Beach County.

The Florida Atlantic University Foundation has received support from more than 6,500 donors, including several large corporations and entrepreneurs. It also generates \$1 million a year from a ground lease agreement for the University Commons shopping center on Glades Road and participates in affinity programs with the Bank of America, Geico and ring-maker Balfour. The foundation has helped young people succeed at FAU by providing scholarships, grants, loans and funds for work-study programs. The foundation also served as a conduit for private gifts of \$3.8 million in cash and pledges for the new FAU stadium.

For fiscal 2010-2011, the foundation generated \$17.3 million in gifts and non-gift revenue. During the same period, the foundation provided \$2.6 million in scholarships, \$3.47 million to faculty and staff members, \$5.7 million to aid university programs and \$734,000 for facilities – primarily for the stadium.

FAU's outreach efforts also have brought many visitors to its campus. The community has been invited recently to hear such guest speakers as Virginia Newmyer of the Smithsonian Institution and Daniel Ellsberg, who released the Pentagon Papers in 1971. Former Secretary of State Madeline Albright is scheduled to speak next February for the Alan B. Larkin Symposium on the American Presidency. The Lifelong Learning Society units in Boca Raton and Jupiter collectively have more than 19,000 members from the community, and each offers a diverse schedule of speakers, musical performances and special events throughout the year. The new Living Room Theaters on the Boca Raton campus attract hundreds of community residents each week. The four theaters are used as classrooms during the day, largely for undergraduate film studies classes.

Young people of all ages come to FAU throughout the year for a variety of reasons, and they consistently report that the university proved to be an excellent host. In Jupiter, the campus has provided housing for Habitat for Humanity volunteers from Ohio State University, the University of Minnesota, Indiana University, Boston University and the

College of St. Rose. FAU's Boca Raton campus has provided housing and meals for hundreds of youngsters attending camps for cheerleading, soccer, football, lacrosse and marital arts.

Just about every weekend features community gatherings on campus, which often serves as a base for charity events, including walks and runs. The Division of Facilities recently assisted event planning for Stand Among Friends, the Alliance for Lupus Research, Relay for Life, the Pap Corps for Cancer Research and the SIDS Alliance Inc.

As a resource for the community, other universities and the media, the Department of Media Relations recently launched a campaign to seek out notable faculty to become part of FAU's Experts Database. The database, created in 2004, is an electronic catalog that allows someone to search by name or subject area to find an expert in a specific field. Currently, more than 350 experts are listed in the database, and they have

been quoted on CNN, the Today program and ESPN, as well as in The New York Times, USA Today, Washington Post, Physician's Weekly, The Wall Street Journal, Palm Beach Post and Sun Sentinel. The most popular areas of expertise are politics, economics and cyber-bullying. As part of the database, the FAU Speakers Bureau provides experts as guest speakers for local clubs and organizations.

FAU's Baldwin House is used for events and receptions, as well as private residence for the President and her family. The purpose of the house is to present a gracious setting for the university to extend its hospitality and to celebrate its achievements. Events there center on gatherings for faculty, students or alumni, recognition of donors, academic milestones and volunteer appreciation.

Student Training and Employment

South Florida employers highly value Florida Atlantic University students, offering them a wealth of opportunities for internships and, upon graduation, permanent employment. Even in this difficult economic climate, FAU students are having solid success finding jobs both in the region and around the country.

Between July 2010 and June of this year, the OWL Careerlink database listed 1,084 unique full-time positions and 979 part-time cooperative and internship opportunities. Employer postings came from CBS Interactive, the village of Wellington, PPL Corp., Verizon Wireless, Clear Channel Communications and the Sun Sentinel, among others. In most cases, students are able to obtain up to four credits toward their degree requirements for participating in an internship.

Most colleges and schools within the university offer internship programs, often for course credit upon successful completion. According to a survey just prepared by the provost, 5,573 students participated in internships and practica during the Summer 2010, Fall 2010 and Spring 2011 semesters. More than 50 percent of all undergraduate programs reported requiring completion of an internship or practicum for

completion of a degree program. Both the College of Engineering and Computer Science and the Honors College reported that 100 percent of their undergraduates participated in internships or practica, followed by 80 percent in Arts and Letters and 70 percent in Science. At the graduate level, 61.5 percent of students in Design and Social Inquiry, 55.3 percent in Education and 54.2 percent in Nursing participated in internships or practica.

At the graduate level, approximately 36 percent of master's and specialist programs require participation in an internship or practicum for completion of their degree program. Twenty-five percent of all doctoral programs require that students participate in an internship or practicum.

Among the examples, the Department of Marketing in the College of Business offers advertising, sales management and retailing internships, including some that are full-time, paid positions. From spring 2009 through this past summer, 32 interns were placed through the program. Over the years, employers included Nordstrom, Island Watersports, Northwestern Mutual and Xerox.

The School of Social Work mandates that students perform community service to earn their degrees. Undergraduates served 229 local community agencies via 369 student placements during the 2010-2011 academic year. During the summer, fall and spring, students performed 110,000 hours of community service. The School of Criminology and Social

Justice placed 26 interns during Spring 2011 with such agencies as the U.S. Marshals Service, U.S. Department of Justice, U.S. Secret Service and various police departments and law firms.

College of Nursing students spent 56,000 hours of clinical and community engagement work at West Boca Medical Center, Pinecrest Rehabilitation Hospital, JFK Medical Center and several other medical facilities. Several history students are performing internships with historical societies and historical organizations, including the Seminole Tribe's Ah-Tah-Yhi-Thi-Ki Museum in the Big Cypress Reservation. Several alumni are employed at the museum and the tribe's historic preservation office.

College of Nursing clinical associate professor Kathleen Valentine encourages students to participate in academic service learning projects at the FAU's Diabetes Center. The Center is a multidisciplinary effort to prevent, manage, educate and research diabetes, and is part of the Palm Healthcare Pavilion in West Palm Beach.

Nursing students also recently completed the first phase of a health project in which they assessed needs and areas of exposure for the community surrounding the Diabetes Center. The students found several barriers to health care access and wellness, including transportation to and from the Center, which gave them a better sense of the neighborhoods being served. The students reported their findings to the Palm

Healthcare executive team, and they continue to build on the assessment and create personal plans for constituents to improve access to healthcare.

Over 70 students participated in the effort and hosted a health fair for over 300 community members. Graduate students also conduct research studies about program effectiveness and operational changes such as the installation of an electronic health record. At the Louis and Anne Green Memory and Wellness Center, students majoring in music, social work, nursing, health care administration, exercise physiology and communication disorders help enrich the lives of the participants through their energy, empathy and enthusiasm.

Some FAU graduates are fortunate to receive permanent employment offers after their internships, while many others say the experience they gained helped them find a job with another employer. And while the economy remains in a slump, a survey of August 2011 graduates indicates that many alumni are having success starting their careers. The university's Career Development Center reports that of the 786 new graduates who responded to a recent survey, 46.6 percent had secured employment after receiving their degrees. Among those who already were employed by graduation, 59.6 percent said they planned to continue in the same job. The average salary for the 172 bachelor's graduates who disclosed their pay was \$39,158. For 73 master's graduates, the figure was \$60,060, and for 10 doctoral graduates, the figure was \$79,800.

Business and Industry

Florida Atlantic University has, over the years, made a major commitment toward working with business and industry, helping to provide jobs in the community, improving the area's economic outlook and bettering the lives of South Florida residents. Through intensified research, development of new technologies and the commercialization of inventions, FAU is growing in prestige among the nation's universities and, even more importantly, among the agencies that fund dynamic, cutting-edge studies.

After declines for three years in the total dollar amount of research awards received, FAU rebounded in fiscal year 2011, bringing in \$43.2 million – the highest since fiscal 2007. Nearly one-fourth of that will go to fund projects at the university's Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institute in Fort Pierce. That turnaround is likely to continue with President Mary Jane Saunders placing a major emphasis on generating research dollars. At her State of the University address in early September, President Saunders told the audience that “we must be committed to double sponsored research in five years.”

Through its Technology Transfer Office, FAU has since 1991 taken advanced and emerging technologies from the laboratory to the commercial sector. As of September 2011, FAU – including Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institute – holds 86 active issued patents. Since 1964, 215 U.S. patents have been

issued to the two entities. Almost 50 inventions have been transferred to industry.

The active agreements include 16 inventions related to high definition cameras licensed to Panavision International L.P.; and an invention related to buried object scanning sonar licensed to EdgeOne LLC/Edge Tech.

One new project has generated interest around the world. Researchers at Harbor Branch have devised a way to reliably culture pearls from the queen conch through a novel seeding technique they developed at the institute. A new partner, Rose Pearl LLC, was formed to introduce the pearl to the industry. Harbor Branch recently received a \$65,000 State University Commercialization Assistance Grant to accelerate development. Ultimately, FAU will receive royalties from sales and a sustainable, Florida-based industry will create skilled jobs to produce and sell the pearl.

To stimulate entrepreneurs and to help companies grow, an immensely powerful economic development engine – the Research Park at Florida Atlantic University – sits at the northern end of the Boca Raton campus and on a site in Deerfield Beach. The park generates ideas, new technologies, jobs and critical economic activity through networking opportunities.

The research park's 22 technology and research and development companies support 782 direct, on-site jobs, paying an overall average salary of \$86,176 – nearly twice the average salaries in Palm Beach and Broward counties.

The companies in the park collectively earn revenues of \$1.58 billion annually, and some have been acquired by major corporations. Among the tenants are Curtis Wright/PSI, which designs and manufactures control components and subsystems for ground defense, ordnance guidance and aerospace applications; Xenco Laboratories, which provides environmental analysis services in 42 states and Latin America; and Vycor Medical Inc., which makes solutions and devices for surgical procedures.

The research park on the Boca Raton campus also provides an incubator – 26 small offices for small startup technology companies. Managed by the Enterprise Development Corporation of South Florida, the incubator lightens the financial burden on entrepreneurs, providing office equipment conference facilities and a shared kitchen. Mentoring by lawyers and certified public accountants is available through Enterprise Development Corporation.

FAU has contributed significantly to the area's economy through design and construction projects – including the stadium and Innovation Village – that totaled \$260 million over the last four years. Some 6,500 workers were employed,

either on-site or off-site, to help provide materials, equipment and services.

After FAU starts to play football in its new stadium this fall, Senior Associate Athletics Director Terry Mohajir estimates that each game will have an economic impact of nearly \$1.8 million, based on an attendance of 21,100. He notes that is a conservative estimate; the economic impact could be higher with a strong opponent that generates greater ticket sales.

Overall, FAU ranks as one of the largest employers in South Florida. The university's regional economic impact exceeds \$1.15 billion, according to a Division of Research report, "Diving Discovery." As of September 2011, FAU had 3,513 employees and a gross payroll for the August 20 to September 2 period of \$8.4 million. Compensation and benefits for the 2009-2010 fiscal year totaled \$244.9 million.

Government and Public Agencies

Florida Atlantic University has strong ties with municipal, county, state and federal agencies. The university played a significant role following the massive Gulf of Mexico oil spill that resulted from a sea-floor oil gusher after the April 20, 2010, explosion of Deepwater Horizon. FAU is a member of the Oil Spill Academic Task Force established by Chancellor Frank Brogan just two weeks later to provide assistance in dealing with the spill and its aftermath. FAU assisted with this national effort, offering a wide range of environmental science, engineering and technology resources. Leading the FAU effort was Dr. Leonard Berry, director of the Florida Center for Environmental Studies, which is based at the university.

Faculty members in FAU's College of Engineering and Computer Science and the Charles E. Schmidt College of Science have been involved in marine and oceanographic work as it relates to the spill. FAU engineers have developed sensors and other technologies that can be used to monitor water quality and contaminant dynamics. Scientists from the Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institute worked to characterize the immediate effects of the spill contamination on marine species, as well as anticipated effects as contamination passes down the food chain.

FAU's Dania Beach-based Institute for Ocean and Systems Engineering (SeaTech), part of the Department of Ocean and Mechanical Engineering and the College of Engineering and Computer Science, enjoys a long-term partnership with the Naval Surface Warfare Center's Carderock Division and its South Florida Testing Facility, which extends offshore south of Port Everglades. The partnership provides extensive in-water test and evaluation capabilities for autonomous underwater vehicles and other underwater systems.

In Boca Raton, FAU is an active participant in the MedUTech initiative, whose goal is to highlight and grow the city's medical and health care, education and technology clusters. Last year, Boca Raton Regional Hospital, which also is involved in the initiative, finalized an agreement with FAU to train doctors for the Charles E. Schmidt School of Medicine. Just recently, FAU served as ambassador for a National Institutes of Health seminar in Weston.

FAU Honors College students worked with the Florida Department of Transportation, conducting surveys on endangered plants threatened by a sidewalk construction project along U.S. 1. Other honors students conducted surveys for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, examining shorebird nesting patterns in Indian River County.

FAU also has a strong relationship with the Palm Beach County School District through various outreach programs for both students and teachers. And thanks to a long-standing partnership between FAU and the district, construction was

completed on a new school at the university's Pine Jog Environment Education Center -- one of the oldest nature centers in the nation, serving more than 25,000 students, 750 teachers and 12,500 adults and families annually. Pine Jog is a unit of FAU's Department of Education.

FAU also has an association with the Gumbo Limbo Environmental Complex in Boca Raton, which is valuable for research and education. FAU's Center for Environmental Studies, in partnership with the South Florida Water Management District, manages a comprehensive education and research center at the Riverwoods Field Lab on a remnant run of the Kissimmee River.

Members of the Division of Facilities have been active on a variety of infrastructure issues, meeting regularly with local and local state agencies to provide feedback and help formulate plans. Representatives have met with city officials in Boca Raton, Davie, Jupiter and Port St. Lucie to formalize campus development agreements and address any required impact fees. They have worked with Palm Beach State College (PBSC) on a sublease of FAU land on the Boca Raton campus to PBSC, and they have developed a sublease agreement with the Palm Beach County School District for construction of a middle school at the Pine Jog Environmental Education Center.

FAU's School of Urban and Regional Planning this summer developed a partnership with the village of Wellington to help create a "Wellington 2060" plan to become a sustainable community with strong residential and economic components

over the next 50 years. The three-year pact will generate \$252,000 for FAU. The partnership calls for the village and FAU to work on five projects, including an assessment of local economic opportunities, plans for a Medical Arts District and an equestrian master plan. A faculty member will serve as liaison, and graduate research assistants will perform much of the research.

A large number of state and federal elected officials visit FAU campuses for meetings with Administration and students. One prominent example that garnered national attention was the 2008 Republican Presidential debate, held in the Student Union.

Tom Donaudy, the FAU architect and vice president for facilities, serves on the board of the Palm Beach Metropolitan Planning Organization, and has provided support and input in obtaining the necessary funding for the design and construction of an Interstate 95 interchange at Spanish River Boulevard. Construction on the \$67 million link is expected to start in 2015.

Universities and Colleges

Florida Atlantic University has strong and growing relationships with other State University colleges in South Florida, both through space sharing and articulation agreements, which permit credits earned in specific state college or community college programs to be transferred to FAU.

FAU's Davie campus is situated on the Broward College main campus, and the two schools work in a close partnership in a setting that creates a supportive learning environment with particular sensitivity to students of nontraditional ages and culturally diverse backgrounds. A high priority is placed on offering the complete upper-division portion of high-demand undergraduate degree programs, in part so that Broward College students can complete four-year degrees by transferring to FAU degrees and remaining on the same campus.

In similar fashion, FAU's Boca Raton campus also is home to Palm Beach State College's south campus. Students can start their college careers at Palm Beach State and complete their four-year degrees at FAU. In both Broward and Palm Beach County, some FAU students take lower-level required classes as transient students at the two-year institutions, both for convenience and for lower tuition costs.

Among the many articulation agreements, a great deal of interest has been generated by one between FAU and Broward College for associate of science graduates in criminal justice. That pact, awaiting final approval, stipulates that FAU will accept 60 credits of the Broward College 63-credit A.S. in criminal justice and will accept students from the program who have met FAU's undergraduate admission requirements, barring any curriculum, space and fiscal limitations. The students would then pursue a bachelor's degree in public safety administration.

Other articulation agreements with the two-year institutions, including Miami-Dade College and Indian River State College, allow students to transfer into a number of FAU degree programs. Among them: Those with an A.S. degree in airport management can transfer to a bachelor's degree program in business administration; those with an A.S. in fire science technology can transfer to a bachelor's degree program in public management; those with an A.S. degree in human services can transfer to a bachelor's degree program in social work.

Cooperative efforts with other universities are diverse, as well. Last year, for example, when the Dalai Lama visited South Florida, FAU and Nova Southeastern University in Davie shared the cost of the visit. And in 2005, after Hurricane Katrina devastated New Orleans, FAU became the temporary home for 45 students from schools in that area, including Tulane and Xavier universities.

Conferences and Meetings

Florida Atlantic University makes several of its facilities available for conferences and meetings that attract both national and local participants. Some events result in significant revenue for the university, while FAU sometimes covers the cost if the gathering is geared to a program sponsored by a division or individual college.

Conferences and meetings generate money through rental of space for training and information sessions, regional corporate meetings, rehearsals and performances. A dance competition in March, for example, brought in almost \$25,000 in gross rental revenue for a three-day event. Groups that have rented space at the Student Union complex include the YMCA, Palm Beach Pops, Summit Lighthouse and Teaching Center of Palm Beach County. Groups that have rented space at the Marleen & Harold Forkas Alumni Center include W.H. Freeman & Co., Southeast Toyota, the Executive Women's Golf Association and the Realtors Association of the Palm Beaches.

Various FAU departments have sponsored events at the Student Union and the Alumni Center. For example, the university hosted the Futures of Medicine Conference, sponsored by the College of Science, and the Lessons and Legacies IX Conference, conducted by the Holocaust

Educational Foundation and hosted by FAU's Holocaust Studies program.

Some 75 community groups, agencies and organizations use the facilities at FAU's Pine Jog Environmental Education Center each year for meetings, retreats, tours, classes and conferences. The events are held both at the center and at the Everglades Youth Conservation Camp. The Garden Club, a Pine Jog partner for more than half a century, holds its annual meeting at the center. And because of the strong relationship between the two entities, the club annually funds a graduate assistantship and donates to restoration projects and Pine Jog's annual fundraiser.

The Wilkes Honors College, on the John D. MacArthur campus in Jupiter, also hosts several conferences each year. In May, the college housed attendees from the University of Florida Integrative Graduate Education and Research Traineeship Conference. The campus also hosts a yearly conference sponsored by the Scripps Howard Institute on the Environment. Participants in the next session, scheduled for May 21-26, will explore developments in science, biotechnology and medicine in addition to the environmental subject matter the program has traditionally included. The expanded agenda will connect the program to FAU's plan to launch a science journalism master's degree program in mid-2012.

Examples of Administrative Structure

Five state universities have offices of community outreach, community engagement or constituent relations, while the others operate university relations or community relations offices. The University of South Florida in Tampa has made a strong effort to partner with the community through its Office of Community Engagement.

The office is headed by a professor who holds a doctorate in political science and has specialized in urban planning and development. The assistant director is an attorney who was a civil litigator before entering a master's program in public administration at the university. The office also has two program assistants and graduate research assistant, all of whom hold master's degrees and are doctoral candidates. The office publishes a quarterly newsletter that showcases service-learning courses and community-engaged research being conducted by University of South Florida faculty and students.

The University of South Florida asserts that it has an annual economic impact of \$3.7 billion, and it cites a high ranking in federal research expenditures, large number of patents produced, development of several research clusters, success of its Small Business Development Center and several public-

private partnerships with high-tech firms and medical care providers.

Florida International University in Miami opened its Office of Engagement in 2010, and it is headed by Dr. Devina Grossman, a registered nurse who was founding dean of FIU's College of Nursing and Health Sciences. She is assisted by Elpagnier Kay Hudson, assistant vice president for the Division of Human Resources and the former HR director at Florida Atlantic University.

FIU's office is focusing on two key areas: curricular engagement and outreach and partnerships, as defined by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching. Curricular engagement includes "institutions where teaching, learning and scholarship engage faculty, students and the community in mutually beneficial collaboration. Their interactions are to address community-identified needs, deepen students' civic and academic learning, enhance community well-being and enrich the scholarship of the institution," according to the foundation.

Outreach focuses on "the application and provision of institutional resources for community use with benefits to both campus and community." Partnerships focus on "collaborative interactions with community and related scholarship for the mutually beneficial exchange, exploration and application of knowledge, information and resources," including research and economic development," the foundation says.

At the University of Central Florida, the Division of Community Relations comprises four departments or offices: Community Relations; Constituent Relations, the Metropolitan Center for Regional Studies and the Office of Global Perspectives.

The Office of Community Relations works directly with the external community by initiating and overseeing events and outreach to the central Florida business community, including chambers of commerce and nonprofit agencies. The office also

works closely with neighbors and groups near campus. The Office of Constituent Relations provides staff support, management, administrative direction and coordination of events for academic programs, donors and campus-related events under the direction of the university president.

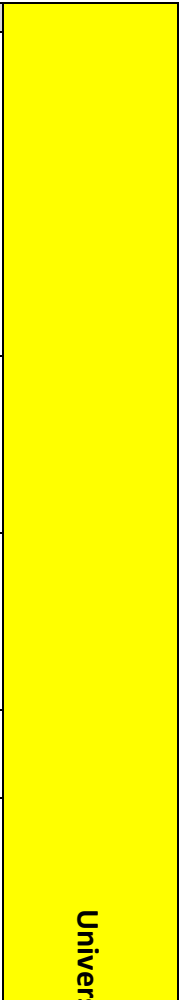
