## Homeland Security Investigations

The U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) is the primary investigative arm of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). With more than 20,000 employees in more than 400 offices around the world, ICE is a key component of the DHS layered defense approach to protecting our nation. Homeland Security Investigations' (HSI) mission is to conduct criminal investigations that protect the United States against terrorist and other criminal organizations who threaten our safety and national security; to combat transnational criminal enterprises who seek to exploit America's legitimate trade, travel, and financial systems; and to uphold and enforce America's customs and immigration laws at and beyond our nation's borders.

**HSI is currently seeking Criminal Investigator (CI) interns for a paid assignment.** Assignments will involve a variety of Criminal Investigator-related tasks but generally you will assist in the collection, collation, and evaluation of information relative to investigations or investigative support programs; aid investigative program management activities; maintain records on specific investigative areas and programs of substantial importance which have high visibility, national interest, or are of a sensitive or restrictive nature; conduct research of statistical data; and gather information used to evaluate the effectiveness and/or efficiency of specific investigative programs.

Positions will be offered at the GS-4 and GS-5 grade levels. Upon successful completion of the program, students **may** be non-competitively appointed to the Criminal Investigator position.

Our Criminal Investigator internships provide numerous opportunities that will challenge your analytical and leadership skills. Candidate qualifications include:

- Pursuing a formal degree program related to the Criminal Investigator occupation at an accredited technical or vocational school, 2 year or 4 year college or university, graduate or professional school;
- U.S. citizenship;
- Taking at least a half-time academic course load in an accredited technical or vocational school, 2 year or 4 year college/university, graduate or professional school;
- Maintaining through graduation a 2.0 GPA;
- Possessing a valid driver's license prior to conversion;
- Passing a background investigation; and
- Completion of a minimum of 640 hours of career-related work before graduation.
