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## PHILOSOPHY

The Philosophy Department offers a bachelor of arts degree program with an emphasis in the liberal arts and at the same time prepares the student for various career opportunities. The intellectual training provided is an excellent preparation for the study of law, the ministry and public service professions, as well as graduate study in philosophy and related disciplines.

In addition to offering the more traditional Philosophy major., the Philosophy Department offers a Pre-Law path of study for students who wish to go on to law school. The department also offers a traditional minor in Philosophy, and three additional paths of study for the minor: a Health Professions option for students who wish to go into medicine or nursing, a Philosophy and the Arts option for students majoring in any of the visual or performance arts and a Science Technology option for students who have an interest in the ethical, epistemological and/or foundational issues in the natural sciences, cognitive sciences, social sciences and/or health professions. Students seeking honors designation in philosophy may pursue the department's Honors in Philosophy program. The programs mentioned in this paragraph are described below after the description of the general Philosophy major.

## Prerequisite Coursework for Transfer Students

Students transferring to Florida Atlantic University must complete both lowerdivision requirements (including the requirements of the Intellectual Foundations Program) and requirements for the College and major. Lowerdivision requirements may be completed through the A.A. degree from any Florida public college, university or community college or through equivalent coursework at another regionally accredited institution. Before transferring and to ensure timely progress toward the baccalaureate degree, students must also complete the prerequisite courses for their major as outlined in the Transition Guides .

All courses not approved by the Florida Statewide Course Numbering System that will be used to satisfy requirements will be evaluated individually on the basis of content and will require a catalog course description and a copy of the
syllabus for assessment.
