FUNDING PRIORITIES

Scholarships for Veteran Students

Gap funding to aid in covering fees, materials, supplies, books and cost of attendance not covered by VA benefits.

>> Support 10+ veteran students
Per semester: \$5,000+ / Endowment: \$130,000+

Academic Advisor/Career Coach Dedicated to Veteran Students

Funding to hire a dedicated advisor/coach to provide one-on-one support and coaching opportunities for FAU's veteran students.

>> \$50,000 / Endowment: \$1.3M

Office & Career Readiness Workspace

This will provide a dedicated area for students to work on applications, receive career counseling, and obtain other information about opportunities available to military and veteran students.

- >> \$15,000 \$25,000; Multiple opportunities available for furnishing and capital improvements
- >> \$25,000+ for named spaces

Events Sponsorship

Events, such as the Meet & Greet, Veterans Day observance, Graduation Cord Ceremony, and networking events, provide resources and support that enhance academic, personal and professional success for students.

>> \$10,000 / Endowment: \$260,000
