AN OWL

1. APPLY

Submit your combined application for undergraduate admissions and merit-based scholarships, along with the \$30 nonrefundable application fee, at *apply.fau.edu* or commonapp.org.

2. CREATE YOUR SSAR

Create your Self-reported Student Academic Record (SSAR) at appstatus.fau.edu.

3. REPORT YOUR SCORE

FAU **requires** an SAT/ACT score to make an admissions decision. Students can selfreport their SAT/ACT scores in the SSAR or send an official score report. Official scores are required from the testing agency before enrollment.
