How to Apply: First-Time in College

Step 1: Submit an online application and fee: Complete the application (Common App or FAU) for admission and pay the non-refundable \$30 application fee online. Visit fau.edu/admissions/international/how-to-apply/

Step 2: First time incoming international students should have their high school records, including courses/subjects and grades completed during the course of their entire high school career and exam results like CXC/GCSES, etc., evaluated by an NACES evaluation agency. FAU will only accept an evaluation conducted by a NACES accredited agency. A list of evaluation service members may be found at **NACES accredited** evaluation website - fau.edu/admissions/eval-agencies/.

Step 3: SAT or ACT test scores are required for all first year applicants. Find SAT test information at <u>collegeboard.com</u> (FAU school code: 5229). Find ACT Test information at <u>actstudent.org</u> (FAU school code: 0729).

Step 4: Students who meet the Florida Board of Governors requirements for college readiness through SAT or ACT sub-section scores in Verbal/Reading and English sections or meet one of four requirements may be academically qualified for admission to FAU and <u>exempt</u> from English Proficiency Exams.

If a student **does not meet** the SAT/ACT sub-section minimums or one of four requirements, they are **required** to submit an **English Proficiency Exam**, to demonstrate their proficiency in the English language, or complete the **Intensive English Institute Academic Track**, an intensive English program, which prepares students to transition into university-level academic programs. How to Apply: Transfer Student

Step 1: Submit an online application and fee: Complete <u>FAU's</u> application for admission and pay the non-refundable \$30 application fee online. Visit <u>fau.edu/admissions/international/how-to-apply/</u>

Summer Semester (Starting in May)	April 15
Fall Semester (starting in August)	July 1
Spring Semester (Starting in January)	November 1

Step 2: Submit official US transcripts and/or a <u>professonially evaluated</u> post-secondary coursework showing course-by-course evaluations on all subjects and grades received from an institution outside the US. Depending on the number of credits completed you may required to meet freshman admission requirements. Step 3: SAT or ACT test scores are required for transfer applicants with less than 30 post-secondary credits earned. Find SAT test information at <u>collegeboard.com</u> (FAU school code: 5229). Find ACT Test information at <u>actstudent.org</u> (FAU school code: 0729).

Step 4: Students who meet the Florida Board of Governors requirements for college readiness through SAT or ACT sub-section scores in Verbal/Reading and English sections or meet one of four requirements may be academically qualified for admission to FAU and <u>exempt</u> from English Proficiency Exams.

Scholarships and Waivers

Scholarships are available for international First-Time in College and Transfer students for Fall and Spring terms only, and are limited in number. For more information, visit fau.edu/admissions/international/scholarships/.

DEPAN INTERNATIONAL FRESHMAN SCHOLARSHIP - \$8,000

Awarded \$2,000 annually over eight consecutive semesters for a freshman on a student visa.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Outstanding academic achievement
- 3.0 minimum GPA
- Minimum English proficiency for admission to FAU
- Evidence of community service or high school involvement

DEPAN INTERNATIONAL TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP - \$4,000

Awarded \$2,000 annually over four semesters for an undergraduate transfer on a student visa.

Eligibility Criteria

- Outstanding academic achievement
- 3.0 minimum GPA
- Minimum English proficiency for admission to FAU
- Evidence of community service or high school involvement



LATIN AMERICAN AND CARIBBEAN SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

International undergraduate students on a student visa who are citizens of Latin America or the Caribbean may be eligible for in-state tuition.

Eligibility Criteria

- Must be admitted to the Wilkes Honors College
- Must register for a minimum of 12 credits of courses per semester at the Wilkes Honors College

PRESIDENT'S INTERNATIONAL FRESHMAN AND TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP - \$24,000

Awarded \$6,000 annually over four semesters for undergraduate freshman and undergraduate transfer students on a student visa.

Eligibility Criteria

- 3.5 minimum GPA
- SAT/ACT scores (Freshman only)
- Up to 60 credits or an AA degree (Transfer only)
- Minimum English proficiency for admission to FAU
- Personal essay and letter of recommendation
