Launched in 2014, the Peace, Justice, & Human Rights (PJHR) Initiative grew out of FAU's highly successful Peace Studies Program, which was founded in the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters in 1999. PJHR is one of nine key "platforms" in the University's Strategic Plan. The Initiative is a university-wide, multidisciplinary, and interdisciplinary effort that brings together scholars, students, practitioners, and community leaders engaged in the themes of social justice, human rights, and peace and nonviolence.

PJHR's collaborative community includes students, university staff, and community partners, as well as nearly 80 Faculty Affiliates who represent disciplines from across the university and FAU's six campuses. PJHR also includes the Barb Schmidt Fellowship, Arthur and Emalie Gutterman Family Center for Holocaust and Human Rights Education, and the Leon Charney Diplomacy Program. PJHR's goal is to create positive change locally, nationally, and internationally by advancing knowledge and bold solutions to social problems through research, teaching and learning, activism, and community engagement.
