## **FAU Presents 'Bodies of Power: Somaesthetics and Politics**

BOCA RATON, Fla. (October XX, 2021) – Florida Atlantic University's Center for Body, Mind, and Culture in the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters will present the virtual conference "Bodies of Power: Somaesthetics and Politics" on Thursday, Nov. 4 and Friday, Nov. 5. This conference will examine the complex relationships between human bodies and the political institutions which govern them. Political regimes are able to maintain their power and domination through control of peoples' bodies. They do so not only by explicit acts of violence and internment but also more insidiously by inculcating somatic norms and habits that support the dominating political authorities and ideologies.

"Our conference 'Bodies of Power: Somaesthetics and Politics' explores not only the multiple ways political authorities wield their power on and through our bodies, but also the ways that we as individuals and groups can find paths of emancipation through more creative, progressive somaesthetic thinking and action," said Richard Shusterman, FAU Dorothy F. Schmidt Eminent Scholar in the Humanities and Director of the Center of Body, Mind and Culture. "The problems of systemic racism and ethnic discrimination that are central to the quest for social justice clearly relate to how bodies appear and are judged in the public realm, but very little attention is given to somaesthetic analysis of these issues."

The conference will include presentations from international scholars based in Korea, India, Poland, Spain, and Italy, as well as scholars from U.S. universities. Martin Jay of the University of California, Berkeley, will give the keynote address.
