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University Galleries, Florida Atlantic University Opens Season with 'New Art: 2018 South Florida Cultural Consortium Fellowship Exhibition'

BOCA RATON, Fla. (August 20, 2018) – The University Galleries in the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters at Florida Atlantic University will Present, "New Art: 2018 South Florida Cultural Consortium Fellowship Visual and Media Artists Exhibition" from Saturday, Sept. 15 through Saturday, Oct. 27 in the Schmidt and Ritter Art Galleries, 777 Glades Road, Boca Raton campus. There will be an exhibition opening reception on Friday, Sept. 14 at 6:30 p.m. beginning in the Schmidt Center Gallery and moving to the Ritter Art Gallery through 8:30 p.m.

The exhibition features 12 artists from four southeastern Florida counties who have won the prestigious annual South Florida Cultural Consortium grant. The opening reception will feature a performance by one of the 2018 grantees, Kat Hernandez, in the Schmidt Center Gallery. The exhibition, opening reception and related public programs (to be announced later) are free and open to the public.

Each year, the South Florida Cultural Consortium awards \$7,500 or \$15,000 visual and media arts fellowships to 12 artists. The award is one of the most lucrative individual artist grants in the United States, indicating that the "Consortium" fellowship is hotly contested each year by the region's best visual and media artists.

This year's exhibition presents recent work by the following 12 artists who have won a 2018 fellowship listed here by county of residence: WE ARE NICE N EASY LLC (Alison Matherly & Jeffrey Noble); Eddie Arroyo, Cristine Brache, Leo Castaneda, Rosa Garmendia, Kat Hernandez, Joseriberto Perez (Miami-Dade); Marielle Plaisir, Samantha Salzinger, Keisha Witherspoon (Broward);

Rick Newton (Palm Beach); and Linda Finch (Martin). The exhibition presents a wide variety of media including drawing, painting, sculpture, film/video, multi-media and photography.

The 2018 version of the South Florida Cultural Consortium Exhibition marks the sixth time since 2001 that the University Galleries have had the honor of presenting this important annual contemporary art exhibition, which revolves between exhibition venues in Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach counties. The University Galleries will publish an illustrated catalogue to document the exhibition with an essay by Angelica Arbelaez, a Miami-based curator who is serving as co-curator of the exhibition with University Galleries director W. Rod Faulds. The exhibition will also be accompanied by public programs such as artists' lectures and film-screenings (dates to be announced).

The University Galleries have an active Museum Education Program offering interactive exhibition tours for schools and other groups by appointment. The University Galleries are open Tuesday through Friday from 1 to 4 p.m. and Saturday from 1 to 5 p.m. The Schmidt Center Gallery is located in the Performing Arts building (building 51), near the Living Room Theaters. The Ritter Art Gallery is in building 39, on the second floor of the Breezeway, east of the Wimberly Library. Daytime visitors can obtain a temporary one-day parking pass online for \$5 at http://parking.fau.edu, or in person at the Information Booth at FAU's main entrance. Visitors can also use the parking meters which cost \$2 per hour. Meters can be paid by downloading the Parkmobile app, or with credit card, debit card or exact paper currency (no change is given). Parking for the opening event is free in designated parking lots.

Finch's history as an artist has been a slow and long one.

She began painting while attending the University of California – Davis as a biological sciences major. After graduating, she relocated to New York City where she lived and worked for over a decade. While art was not at the forefront of her existence, she continued to paint and take courses at NYC's Pratt Institute and The New School.

After moving to South Florida in the 1990s, Finch began to pursue painting and illustration, more specifically, children's book illustration. As a part-time illustrator, she illustrated children's books and magazines for the educational and trade markets. During this time, Finch was also fully employed by The Nature Conservancy at Blowing Rocks Preserve. During her 24-year tenure with the Conservancy, she curated art exhibits that featured multi-media artists throughout the State of Florida. The goal of these exhibits was to connect art with our natural world and to provide an educational message about conservation issues that impact us in Florida as well as globally.

Finch's long road as an artist finally evolved into full-time painting by 2010.

He resided in his home state, in the small seaside town of Juno Beach, until moving to Boston where he earned his BFA with honors from the Massachusetts College of Art. Relocating back to south Florida in 1997, where he currently resides, he taught high school level advanced placement classes in drawing and sculpture at the Alexander Dreyfoos School of the Arts for one year. That same year he began making his current body of work. He has given presentations and lectured on his work and exhibited at Florida Atlantic University and taught workshops at the Palm Beach Institute of Contemporary Art (PBICA) under

Michael Rush. Rick Newton's work is included in distinguished private collections across the United States and in Europe. In the last fifteen years he has exhibited his work internationally and nationally, including shows in New York City and highly regarded art fairs such as Art Miami.

Joseriberto Perez

Perez (b. 1984) received a MFA from The School of the Art Institute of Chicago in 2017. In 2014 Perez received the Cannonball local artist in residency for the year. Finding a preoccupation with anthropology and its developments and connection with modern art and aesthetics, Perez oeuvre is characterized by a perpetual state of indeterminacy, that seeks to mine the reductive aesthetic signifiers of 20th Century Modern Art. His choice for working within the materiality that he sets out to engage with and the processes he puts them through are all informed by personal and cultural experiences manifested in the materials worked with like linen, burlap, for example and the processes used such as dyeing and washing fabric as well as sewing and silkscreening them. Through a juxtaposition between objects and paintings within installation type presentations the artist attempts to demystify while interjecting a new type of wonder or misread into the narrative of image and object relation and there place as signifier in the realm of aesthetics and life. The imagery used in the paintings and prints draw heavily on colloquial sensibilities associated with the Afro-Caribbean motifs and styles. Miami is a source of inspiration and figures very importantly within the work providing the dynamics of both nature and culture as they intersect, overlap and endure within its ever-changing landscape.

Marielle Plaisir

Plaisir is a French-Caribbean multi-media artist, who combines painting, drawing, monumental installations and performance to present highly intense visual experiences. She's working on blends life and fiction in self-personal narratives and historic narratives from Caribbean touching on universal themes like power, domination, life and death. She find inspiration in Italian quattrocento, Latin, Caribbean and American literature. She uses her daily practice to examine the many aspects of the individual in the society. She uses textiles, fibers, fabrics which are socially meaningful.

Through her artworks she find moments of humor and beauty and discovers evidence of humanity in our increasingly digital world. From monumental works, to itinerating in-situ exhibitions, along with books and illustrations for the youth and drawings for animation, Plaisir's works demonstrates a strong urge to produce poetical pieces. Her essence is theatrical. Since 2002, Plaisir has exhibited in numerous group shows, and solos exhibitions throughout the world. She has participated in various International Biennials of Contemporary Art. Plaisir is also the creative director of the luxury accessories LES BARBARES . As a textile designer, she's

collaborating with The French designer furniture company Roche-Bobois for tueur new Collection 2018-2019.

Samantha Salzinger

Salzinger is best known for constructing large-scale dioramas that are carefully lit and photographed to create the illusion of a sublime landscape in a strange land. Samantha obtained her MFA in photography from Yale University where she was awarded George Sakier Memorial Scholarship and her BFA from Florida International University.
