The Foreign Language Achievement Testing Service (FLATS) is a computerized multiple-choice language examination designed by Brigham Young University (BYU) to cover the knowledge and skills that would be acquired during the first three semesters of college-level language courses.

It has three testing areas: listening, reading, and formal grammar. There is no speaking portion.

Students are given two and a half hours to complete the test.

Students are not allowed the use of any outside materials whatsoever during the test.

Students passing the FLATS satisfy the Foreign Language Exit Requirement of Florida Atlantic University and do not receive credits.

Students failing the FLATS can retake it after six months with the proper registration and payment of fees.

Because FLATS is the exclusive property of BYU, students who wish to take it must pay a fee (currently \$50.00) directly to BYU via the official FLATS website https://flats.byu.edu/signupall.php. BYU does not release the examination until this fee is paid.

To register, students go to https://flats.byu.edu/signupall.php.

When the proctor receives via e-mail a registration confirmation with the information to log into the examination page, students are contacted via phone to schedule an appointment. Students take the examination in the testing room of the Department of Languages, Linguistics, and Comparative Literature (LLCL), which is located in the Culture and Society Building (CU 97) - room 232, and operates Monday to Friday from 8:30 to 5:00.

It takes up to two weeks for the proctor to receive the official FLATS scores report via mail. Upon reviewing the FLATS scores report by a designated LLCL faculty member, the proctor notifies the Registrar's Office with the results via e-mail to update students' records.
