Dear Parents:

I am pleased to invite your student(s) to FAU's 10<sup>th</sup> annual Honors High School String Orchestra "Sideby-Side" Festival on **October 14 & 15, 2022**. **The deadline for registration is Monday, September 26, 2022**. All participating students must fill out the registration form and the permission form. Any student who will take daily or emergency medication during the festival will also need to submit the Permission to Administer form. These forms need to be filled out and submitted online. There is a participation fee of \$40.00. This covers a festival T-shirt, lunch on Friday, and both lunch and dinner on Saturday. All meals will be served in the Atlantic Dining Hall (an all you can eat buffet) located adjacent to the Student Union. Checks or money orders should be made payable to "FAU" (not the FAU Foundation, as in previous years), and given to your child's high school orchestra director, turned in at the registration table on Friday morning upon arrival at FAU, or mailed directly to Laura Joella at FAU, Department of Music, 777 Glades Rd, Boca Raton, FL 33431.

This event will culminate in a side-by-side performance with students from high school orchestras from around the state performing with Florida Atlantic University Orchestra students. Repertoire for this year's festival will be selected from the following: John Corigliano's Voyage, Gregory Walker's arrangement of George Walker's Lyric for Strings: for Young Musicians, Joseph Guy Marie Ropartz's Serenade, Karl Jenkins's Allegretto from *Palladio*, Johann Stamitz's Sinfonia in A Major "Mannheim No. 2," and Jennifer Meckler's arrangement of Joseph Bologne Chevalier De Saint-Georges's Ballet No. 6 from *L'amant anonyme*.

The two-day festival schedule will involve rehearsals of the repertoire listed above from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm on both Friday and Saturday, culminating in a concert at 7:00 pm on Saturday. For interested students, auditions for all solos and the section leader positions will be held at 8:00 am on Friday. Admission to the concert is free, but tickets and seats must be reserved at this site: <a href="fauevents.com">fauevents.com</a>. The auditorium doors will open at 6:30 pm for the 7:00 pm concert. Have your student(s) wear comfortable walking shoes because there may be a walking tour of campus on Saturday, October 15, weather permitting.

Please encourage your child to obey your school's chaperone policy to ensure that your child is supervised during down times or in emergency situations. Should you or your child require hotel accommodations, our office will be happy to assist you in finding a location near our campus. You will receive online access to the marked musical parts for audition and practice purposes. Original repertoire will be provided to your students upon their arrival at FAU. All students (except double bassists) need to bring mutes for the Ropartz. Concert dress for the performance is the attire students usually wear for their high school orchestra concerts. For some students this is a uniform, or a specific color like all black, or black and white. The FAU students will be dressed in the following: tuxedos or all black formal attire.

There is no free parking on campus on any day. A visitor's daily parking pass (including vehicles for teachers, chaperones & students) can be purchased online in advance when registering with the link above. This pass is \$5 per day and uses license plate recognition. There is nothing to place in your car. It can be used to park in any blue lot. The closest blue lots are Lot 1 and Parking Garage 2. Alternatively, visitors may park at metered spots (\$2.50 an hour), and also have the option to park in any blue lot using the ParkMobile app to get a temporary ePermit at the same \$2.50 hourly parking rate.
