

2023 OUTSTANDING HOLOCAUST EDUCATOR AWARDS SPONSORED BY THE GUTTERMAN FAMILY FUND

Purpose

The award recognizes educators who have demonstrated a positive impact on their schools and community in the field of Holocaust, genocide, and human rights education. Established by Arthur Gutterman for FAU's Arthur and Emalie Gutterman Family Center for Holocaust and Human Rights Education - CHHRE, the award honors individuals who actively, through teaching about these difficult subjects and their personal example, strengthen South Florida students' world-citizenship and capacity to uphold the dignity of all persons.

Award

Gutterman Outstanding Educators will be recognized at the Annual Educators Appreciation Dinner. The award enables recipients to participate in a Holocaust travel-study program. The award includes, but is not limited to, airfare, lodging, meals and tours. Other costs are the responsibility of the participant.

Eligibility

Awards will be presented to teachers who have taught about the Holocaust, other genocide/s, and human rights for at least three years in Broward, Palm Beach, Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River Counties in Florida.
