Description

- Work during the entire legislative session and witness first-hand how legislation is passed in Tallahassee
- Develop your written and oral communication skills as you interact with legislators, professional staff, constituents and lobbyists
- Develop your abilities to time-manage projects, network and provide leadership on issues important to Florida communities

Application opens October 7 on Handshake and closes November 7

Eligibility for the Internship:

- Open to full-time undergraduate and graduate students of all majors
- Must have a minimum of 30 credit hours at time of application
- Must be 20 years of age on January 1, 2023
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.25
- Previous internship experience preferred (does not need to be in government)

- Students will be required to register for a prescribed full-time course curriculum & will not be able to exceed 12 credit hours
- Students selected for this internship experience will be provided housing and transportation costs, as well as a \$3,000 living stipend
- This incredible opportunity is only offered in Spring 2023
