## About Lambda Pi Eta:

Lambda Pi Eta was founded by the students of the Department of Communication at the University of Arkansas and was then formally endorsed by the faculty member and founder, Dr. Stephen A. Smith in 1985. The Speech Communication Association – now the National Communication Association – established Lambda Pi Eta as an affiliate organization and as the official national honor society for outstanding students in Communication in 1994. In February 1996, Lambda Pi Eta was inducted into the Association of College Honor Societies. Today, there are over 600 chapters of Lambda Pi Eta nationwide.

The purpose of the Honor Society, according to the national Policies and Procedures is:

- To recognize, foster, and reward outstanding scholastic achievement
- To stimulate interest in the field of Communication
- To provide an opportunity to discuss and exchange ideas in the field of Communication
- To promote and encourage professional development among Communication majors
- To establish and maintain close relationships and mutual understanding between faculty and students
- To explore options for further graduate education

The membership in Lambda Pi Eta is composed of undergraduate students who have declared an interest in the field of Communication and have achieved a high level of academic excellence.

To be eligible for membership, students must have completed 60 semester hours (90 quarter hours) in undergraduate courses; have a cumulative Grade Point Average of at least 3.0; have completed the equivalent of 12 semester hours (18 quarter hours) in Communication courses; have a Grade Point Average of at least 3.25 in those courses; and be currently enrolled as a full-time student in good standing with their institution.
